

7. Setting Up an English Language Environment by Having an English Day

- **Creating the atmosphere**
 1. English posters
 2. Bilingual words on the walls and boards
 3. Notice-boards

- **Games / songs / poems**
 1. Fishing for missing words
 2. Matching games - pictures with words
 3. English songs
 4. Treasure hunt

- **Competitions**
 1. Songs, e.g. Christmas carols
 2. Favourite characters - dressing up
 3. Slogans
 4. Quizzes, e.g. Weakest Link / Who wants to be a millionaire?

- **Library activities**
 1. Book exhibition
 2. Story telling
 3. Introduction of good reading books

- **Hall activities**
 1. Variety show – every class does a performance in English – (e.g. magic, song, drama)
 2. Talent show
 3. Drama
 4. Showing cartoons

5. Showing movies
6. Cooking corner, e.g. making jelly with instruction
7. Games stall
8. Short story relay – groups of students in line listening and passing on a sentence

- **Using the tuckshop**

1. Buy and sell food
2. Label food

- **Shopping activities**

- Set up stalls and give P5 / 6 students a budget so it becomes a problem – solving activity; give P1 to P3 a shopping list

- **Newsletter**

1. Classes take turns to do the newsletter with pictures
2. Having P5 / 6 students as reporters gathering information and pictures about their English Day and with the help of the NET, prepare the newsletter

- **Festivals / theme-day**

1. Halloween - masks, candy bags, face painting, witches hats, pass the pumpkin around a circle, fashion show
2. Christmas – sing carols, design and write cards
3. Easter – Easter egg hunt
