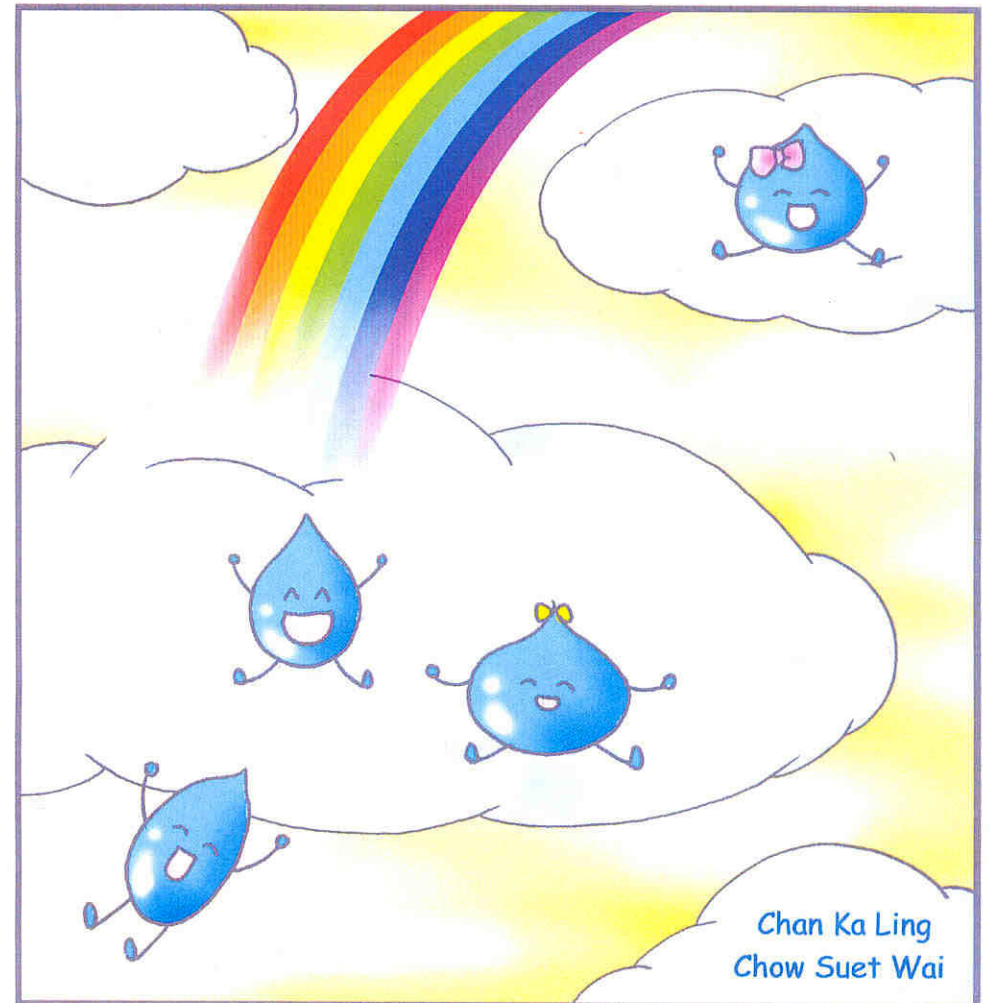

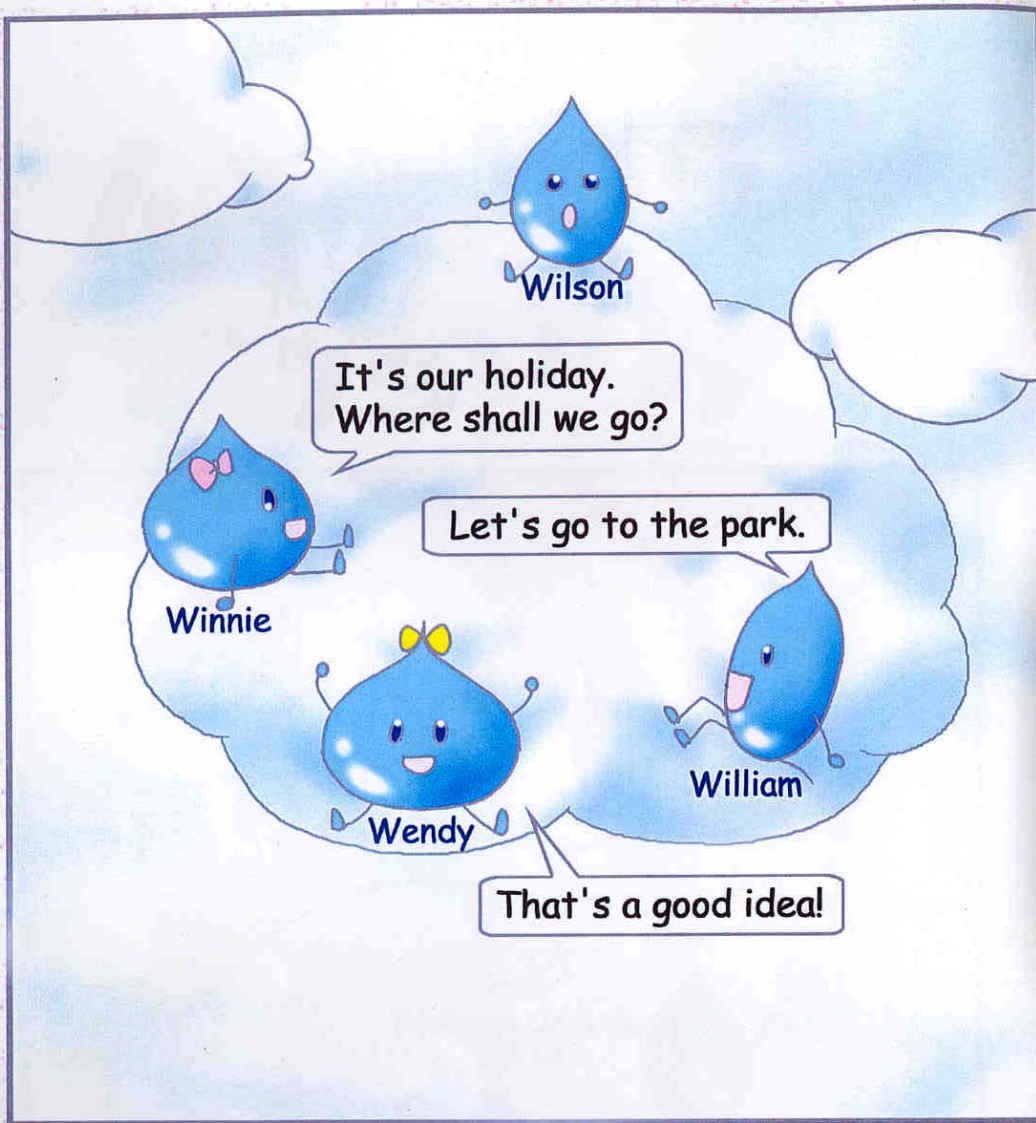

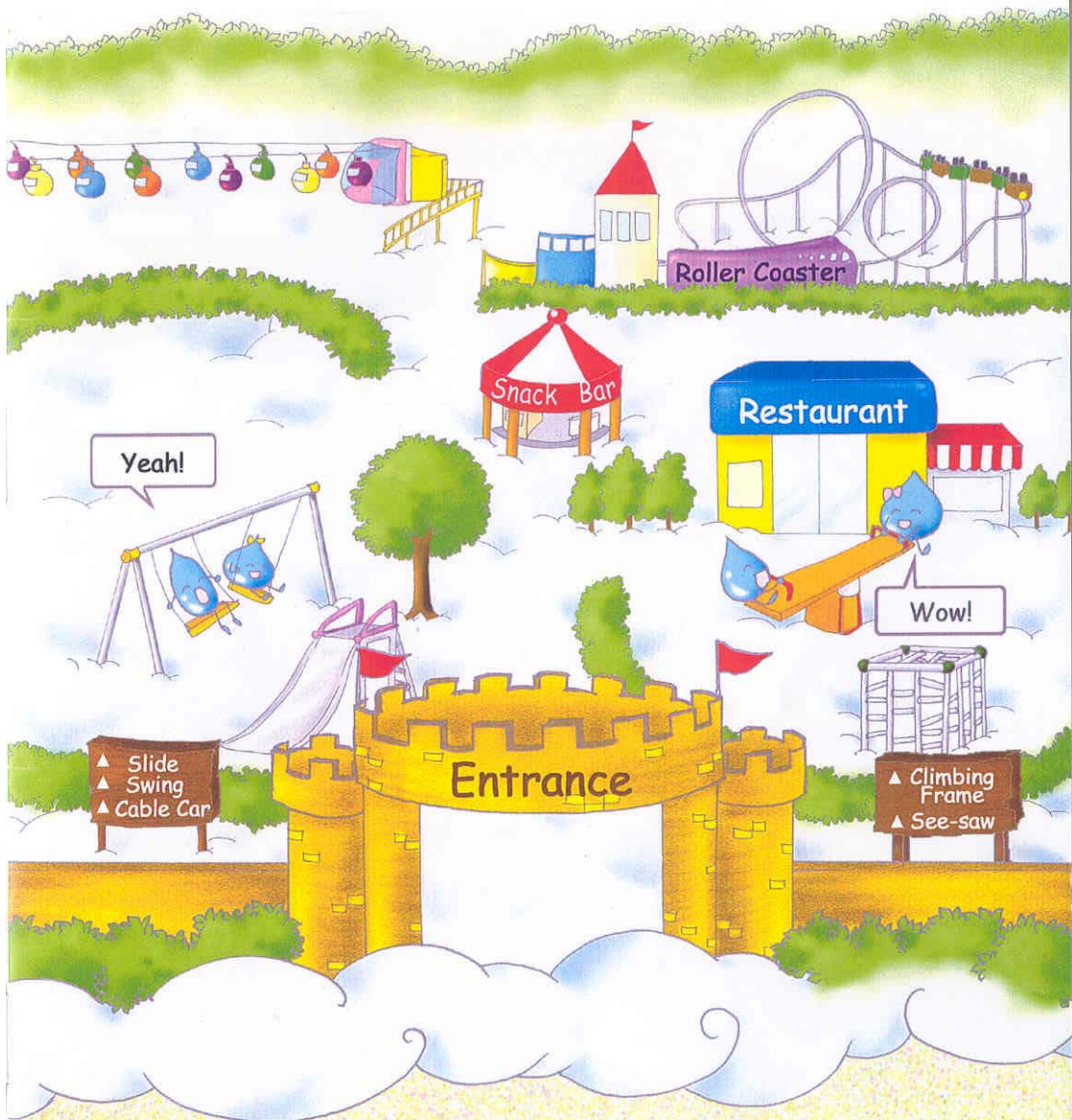
# Wonderful Water

Where will their next journey take them?

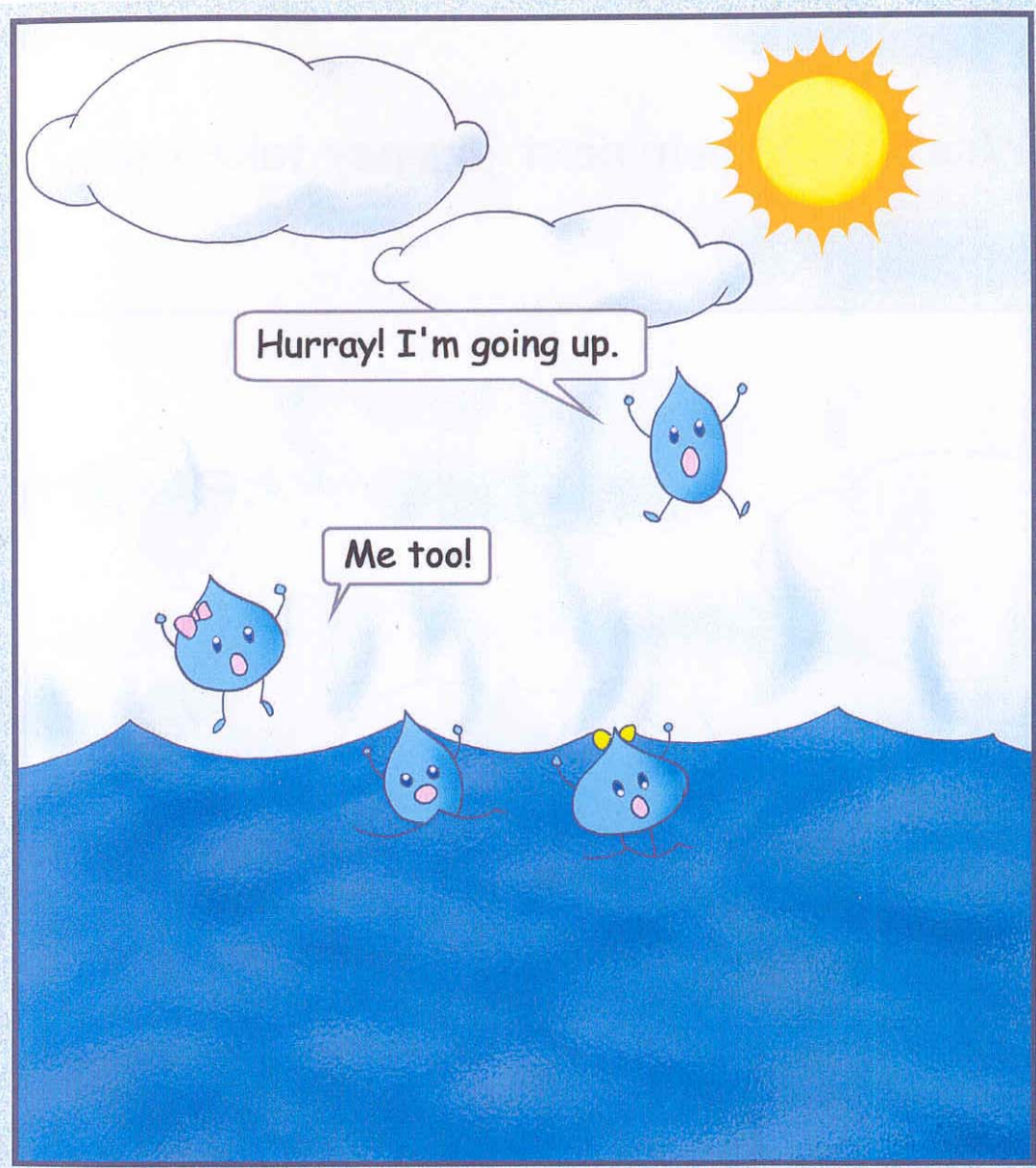


The water droplets are playing happily in the park.



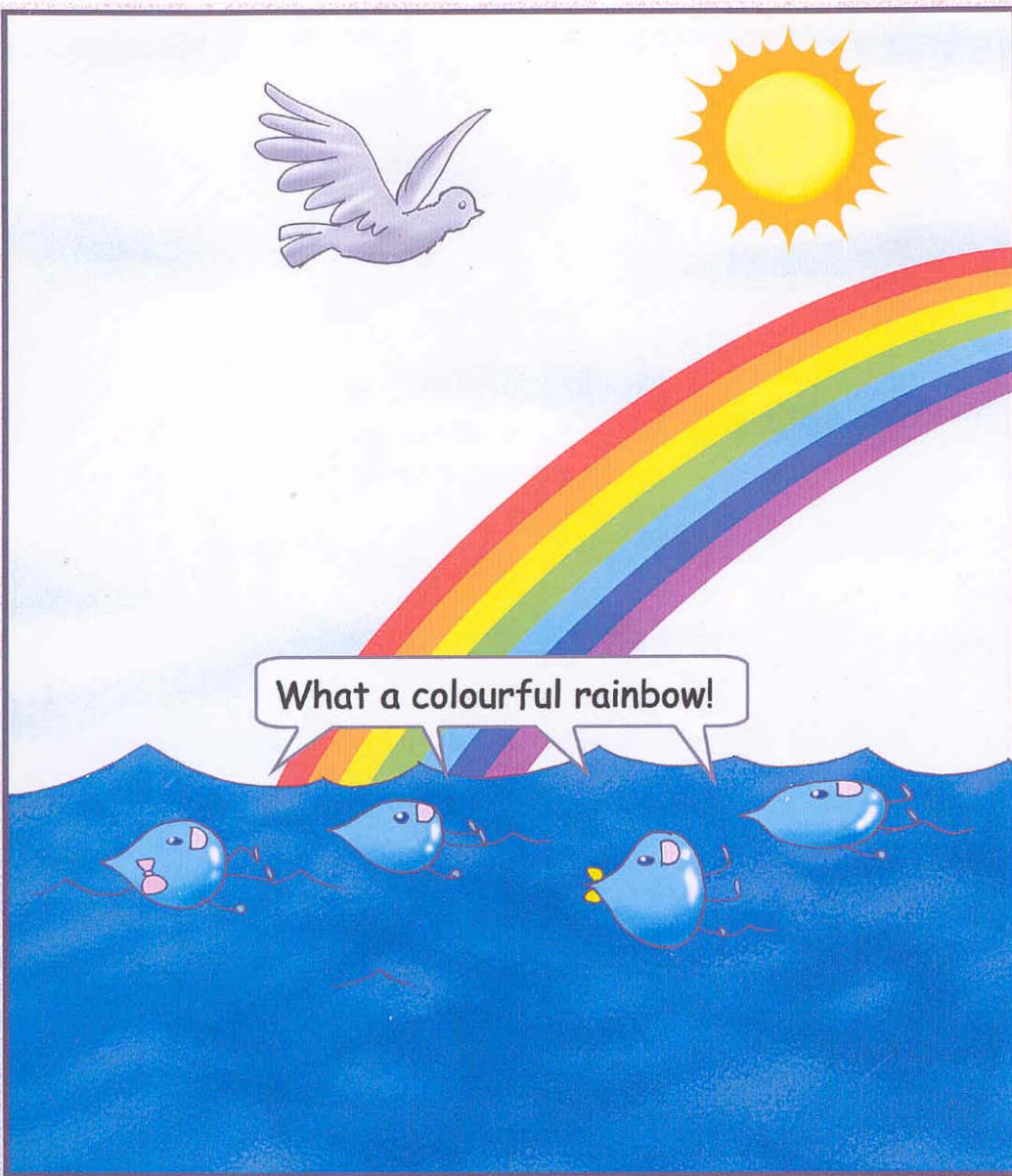
Many water droplets play with them.

They form a cloud.

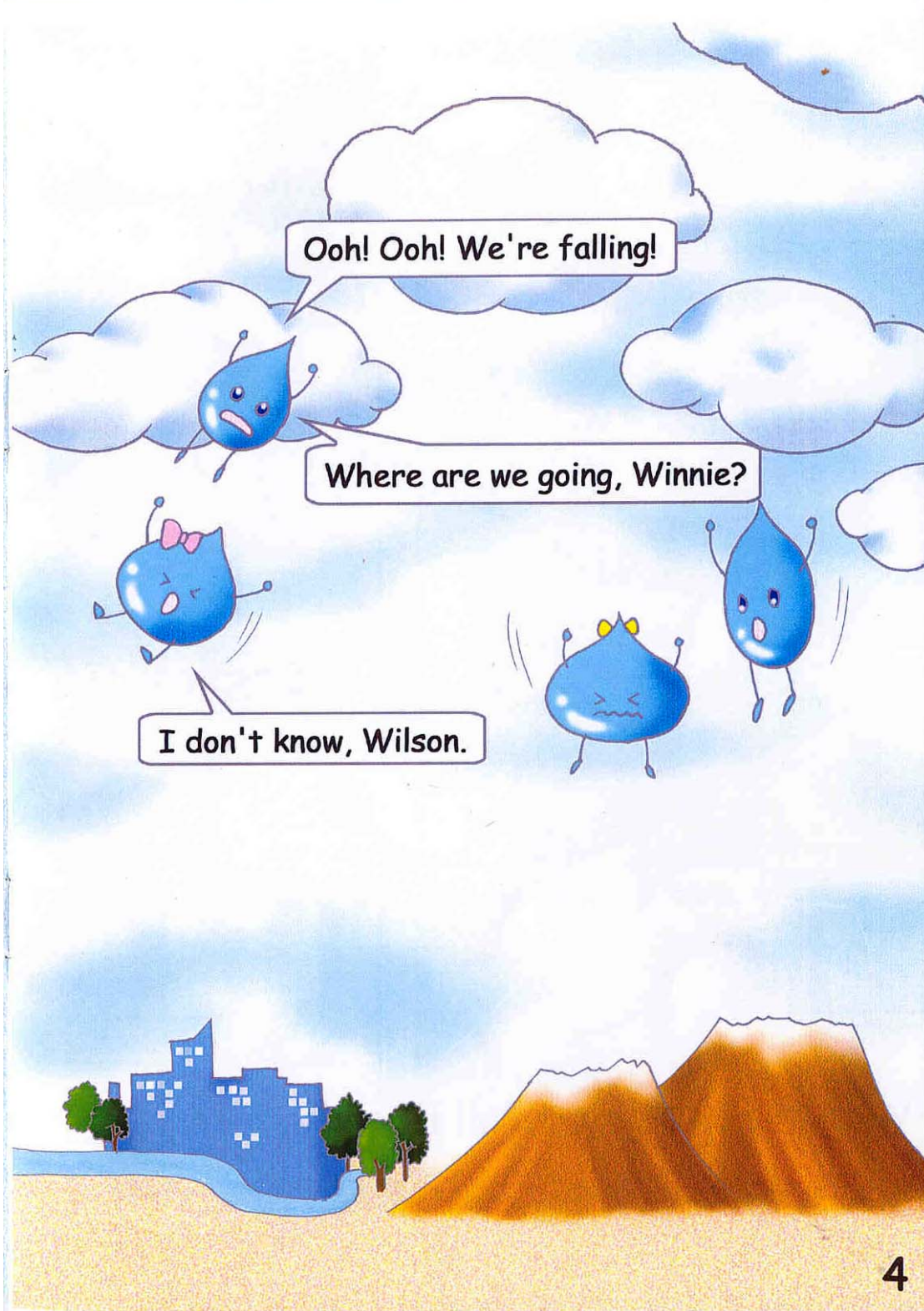
💡 *Why do the water drops rise up?*

💡 How many colours are there in a rainbow?

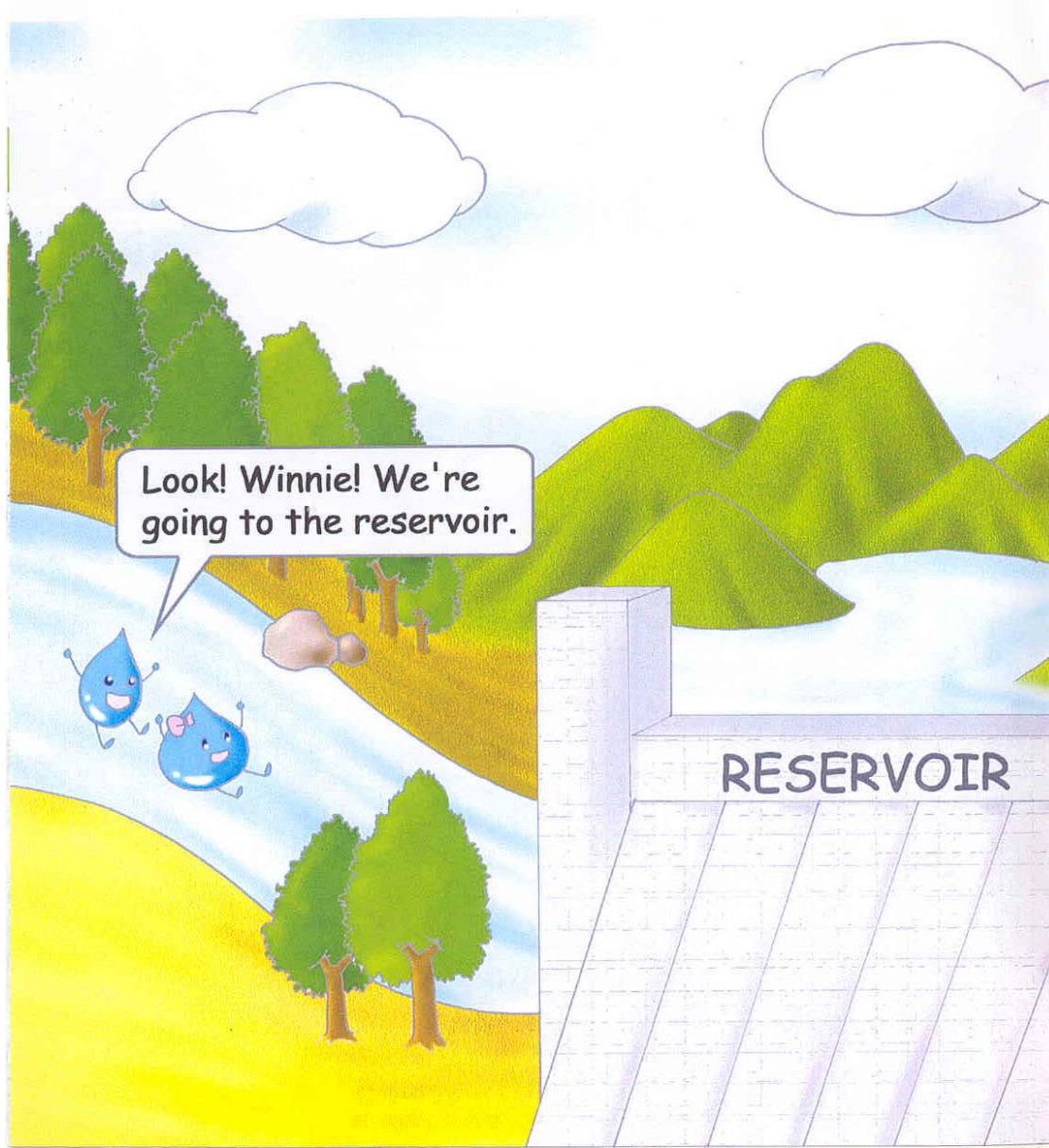


Ooh! Ooh! We're falling!

I don't know, Wilson.






Look! Winnie! We're going to the reservoir.

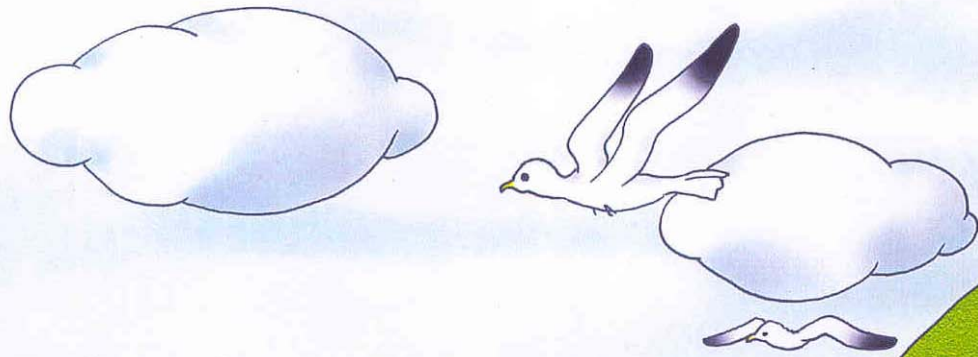

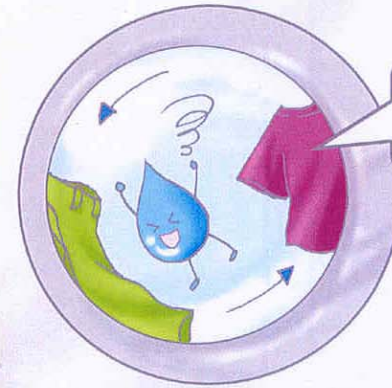
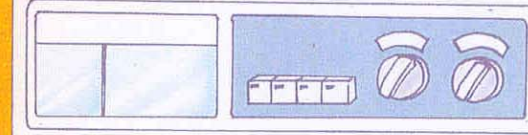




Ouch! What's this?
