## School-based Gifted Education Programmes Evaluation of Student's Works

- 1. Outstanding scope of knowledge
  - Do the works reflect the student possesses deeper and broader knowledge and expertise than his/her peer group?
- 2. Outstanding quality of works
  - Is the quality of the student's works much higher than that of their peer group?

    Such as: Content: The idea and depth of content reaches a higher level than that of their peer group. Its complexity is sometimes beyond his/her peers' understanding.

Details: Able to illustrate complicated content in detail, for example, to give explanation with illustrations or examples

Organisation: The contents are carefully and skillfully organised

Presentation: Presentations are creative and stylish. The student can efficiently use the resources on hand, for example, applying 3D format while others simply use 2D.

Overall impression: Its overall performance is much better than that of his/her peers.

- 3. Attitude and eagerness reflected by his/her works
  - Based on the efforts made and the time spent by the student to assess the quality of works
  - Does the student feel pride when presenting his/her works?
- 4. Innovation
  - Does the work meet the requirements of the theme?
  - Is the concept creative?
  - Is the work unique and stylish and able to inspire the audience's thought or give them new experience on the topic or issue?

For example, is there any new idea in the essay?

Is the means of presentation unique?

Does the message transit unique points of view?
