**Promotion of Reading Grant for the 2024/25 School Year** 

**Summary** 

This circular memorandum announces the revised amounts of the Promotion of Reading Grant for all public sector schools for the 2024/25 school year. This circular memorandum should be read in conjunction with the EDBC No. 10/2018 on Promotion of Reading in Schools.

**Details** 

2. Starting from the 2018/19 school year, the Education Bureau (EDB) has disbursed the Promotion of Reading Grant to all public sector schools to support them in strengthening the promotion of reading and encourage students to develop a good reading habit from a young age. The grant is adjusted in accordance with the movement of the Composite Consumer Price Index each year. The amounts of the grant for the 2024/25 school year have been adjusted upward by 1.5%. The revised amounts of the grant are as follows:
