

## **Measures for Supporting the Promotion of Reading**

The Education Bureau (EDB) has spared no effort over the years to promote reading and continues to adopt a multi-pronged approach to support primary and secondary schools to promote reading effectively. The measures for supporting the promotion of reading include:

### **(1) Student Activities and Teacher Professional Development Programmes**

A number of reading-related student activities and teacher professional development programmes are organised every year in order to enhance students' interest in reading and teachers' professional capacity in promoting reading. To facilitate schools in obtaining relevant information for planning school-based promotion of reading activities, the EDB will continue to update the "Calendar for Promotion of Reading Activities" in the EDB website to provide schools with up-to-date information on various reading-related student activities and teacher professional development programmes organised by the Curriculum Development Institute. ### **(2) Theme-based Reading**

The EDB recommends reading themes and provides suggested book lists to schools, including Chinese History and Culture, Healthy Living, Values Education and STEAM Education. Schools can encourage students to read books on the suggested book lists and organise different types of school-based reading activities according to the reading theme. ### (3) Theme-based Reading eBook Lists and Suggested Reading Activities

To encourage primary students to develop an interest in reading from a young age, the EDB has selected eBooks themed on “Inspirational Reading” from the electronic collection of the Hong Kong Public Libraries and categorised them into three reading themes, namely “Growth and Inspiration”, “Scientific Discovery and Aerospace Technology” and “Biography or Success Story of Celebrities”, so that students can develop proper values, attitudes and behaviour through reading. In addition, each eBook comes with suggested reading activities for schools’ reference and adoption. Schools may tailor-make or design suitable reading tasks according to the interests and abilities of their students, and school-based curriculum with a view to developing students’ reading interests and learning skills. These include picture books, e-books, illustrations, short videos, and animations, all accessible via the EDB EMM website (<https://emm.edcity.hk>) and mobile application. Teachers are encouraged to make flexible use of these resources to foster reading across the curriculum, enhance students’ interest and proficiency in reading, and cultivate a lifelong reading habit. Among these resources, the “Lifelong Love of Reading” series (<https://emm.edcity.hk/category/258B/341023142>) showcases schools’ reading initiatives and guest book recommendations, conveying positive energy and proper values, inspiring students to seek wisdom through reading and lead fulfilling lives.
