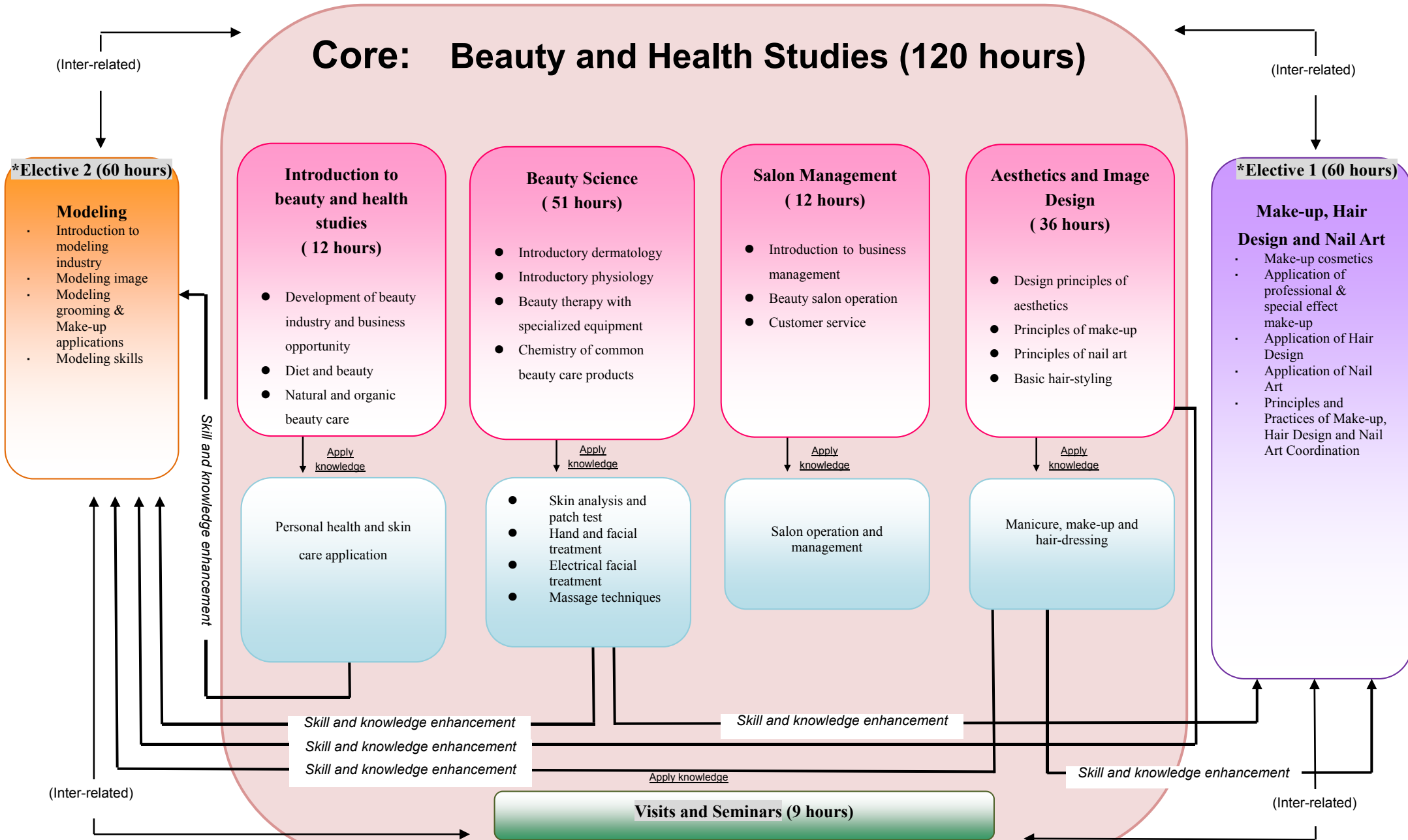

Learning Outcomes	<p>Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) integrate and apply knowledge of Physiology, Dermatology and Beauty Science in devising beauty treatment plans; (2) understand and apply the fundamental principles of customer service and ethical practices in the beauty industry; (3) identify the needs of the clients and evaluate the effectiveness of a treatment process and make appropriate adjustments to the treatment plan based on the client's condition after an initial treatment; (4) understand basic salon operation procedures and observe the hygienic and safety measures in beauty salon; (5) integrate the general knowledge of personal health with beauty care and make appropriate recommendation for health and beauty care; (6) apply knowledge of aesthetics to design and create various make-up effects, hair styles and nail art patterns; and (7) develop self-understanding for further studies and career development in related fields.
