Invitation to Expression of Interest

The purpose of this Expression of Interest exercise is to invite institutions to express their interest in developing Applied Learning courses for the cohorts of students sitting the 2026, 2027 and 2028 HKDSE.

Applied Learning Curriculum

According to The Report *Action for the Future – Career-oriented Studies and the New Senior Secondary Academic Structure for Special Schools* (Education Bureau, August 2006), Applied Learning (formerly known as Career-oriented Studies) is an integral part of the senior secondary curriculum. As stated in *Applied Learning Curriculum and Assessment Guide (Senior Secondary Level)* (Curriculum Development Council and Hong Kong Examinations and Assessment Authority, 2009, with updates in 2017), Applied Learning aims to:

- enable students to understand fundamental theories and concepts through application and practice, and to develop their generic skills in authentic contexts; and
- provide students with opportunities to explore their career aspirations and orientation for career development and lifelong learning in specific areas.

All Applied Learning courses are to be developed and delivered in accordance with the guiding principles, curriculum aims and objectives as set out in the curriculum guides (e.g. *Applied Learning Curriculum and Assessment Guide (Senior Secondary Level)*), circulars, guidelines and other relevant documents from the Education Bureau. More specifically, Applied Learning courses are designed according to the principles of balance, coherence, articulation and responsiveness to provide a sound learning platform for students. Students will be prepared for further studies and/or for work as well as for lifelong learning through the development of foundation skills, thinking skills, people skills, values & attitudes and career-related competencies.

Vocational and professional education and training (VPET) plays a role in providing flexible and multiple pathways for students with diverse aspirations and abilities. At the senior secondary level, the understanding of VPET can be deepened through Applied Learning, which offers learning contexts linked to broad vocational and professional fields.

Applied Learning courses are developed to provide a balanced portfolio of courses matching stakeholders' expectations. There are six areas of studies in Applied Learning, namely, Creative Studies; Media and Communication; Business, Management and Law; Services; Applied Science; and Engineering and Production. In addition, there are Applied

Learning Chinese (for non-Chinese speaking students) (ApL(C)) to provide an additional channel exclusively for non-Chinese speaking students to obtain an alternative Chinese language qualification to prepare them for further studies and career pursuits.

Implementation Arrangements

Applied Learning courses are Category B subjects of the HKDSE. All senior secondary students studying the curriculum prepared by the Curriculum Development Council and published for use in schools by the Education Bureau may take a maximum of two Applied Learning courses as elective subjects according to their interests and aspirations. Non-Chinese speaking students meeting specified circumstances can also take one ApL(C) course. The duration of each Applied Learning course (except ApL(C)) is 180 contact hours, generally spanning two school years at the senior secondary level, commencing either at S4 (to be completed at S5) or at S5 (to be completed at S6). The duration of each ApL(C) course is 270 contact hours, spanning S4 to S6.

Schools may adopt the following two non-exclusive modes in implementing Applied Learning courses to suit their school contexts:

- Mode 1: Lessons to be held mainly on Saturdays at the venues of the course providers and delivered by tutors recognised by the course providers. Schools should arrange their students to attend the lessons according to the timetables set by the course providers.
- Mode 2: Lessons to be held mainly in schools offering courses and delivered by tutors recognised by the course providers. Schools have to reach an initial agreement and formulate the implementation details with the course providers, including timetables, class venues and provision of facilities, etc.

Schools may also consider collaborating with other schools to offer Applied Learning courses with the support of the course providers.

Expression of Interest

This invitation to Expression of Interest is to enhance the course provision of Applied Learning courses.

Each interested institution can submit at most six proposals. These do not include proposals on Applied Learning Chinese (for non-Chinese speaking students) and Applied Learning (Vocational English), for which at most one proposal could be submitted each for Applied Learning Chinese (for non-Chinese speaking students) and/or Applied Learning (Vocational English).

The eligibility requirements for institutions to develop Applied Learning courses are at **Appendix I**.

If your institution is interested in submitting an Expression of Interest for the Government's consideration, please:

- Observe the Eligibility Requirements (**Appendix I**)
- Complete the Expression of Interest (**Appendix II**).

The Expression of Interest can be completed in English or Chinese, except for parts specified to be in bilingual format. A separate sheet must be used for each proposal submitted by your institution. Please provide both hard and soft (in "Word" format saved on a CD-ROM) copies.

Please send your Expression of Interest in a **sealed envelope** addressed to Executive Officer (Curriculum Development)³, Administration Section of Curriculum Development Institute; File Reference: EDB/CDI/ApL/07-04-05(CD-EOI2201); Title: ***"Invitation to Expression of Interest – Applied Learning Course Provision"***. The Label at **Appendix IV** must be affixed on the envelope.

The sealed envelope containing the Expression of Interest must reach the **Administration Section of Curriculum Development Institute, Education Bureau at Room W130, 1/F, West Block, EDB Kowloon Tong Education Services Centre, 19 Suffolk Road, Kowloon Tong, Kowloon, Hong Kong** AT or BEFORE **6:00 p.m. (Hong Kong time) on 8 June 2022 (Wednesday)** (the "Closing Date"). Please **DO NOT** send your submissions by email or fax. The normal working hours are Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, 8:30 a.m. (Hong Kong time) to 6:00 p.m. (Hong Kong time); Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays excluded. In case Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 or above is hoisted, or Black Rainstorm Warning Signal or "extreme conditions after super typhoons" announced by the Government is/are in force for any duration between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on the closing date, the closing time will be extended to 6:00 p.m. on the first working day after the Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 8 is lowered, or the Black Rainstorm Warning Signal or "extreme conditions after super typhoons" announced by the Government has/have ceased to be in force. Late submissions will not be considered under any circumstances.

Upon the Closing Date of submission, the Government will consider the Expression of Interest submitted by all institutions and decide if any follow-up action is required. If necessary, the Government would request institutions concerned to submit detailed course proposal for further consideration. This invitation does not constitute an offer or suggestion to offer Applied Learning courses, nor does it constitute the basis of any contract which may be concluded in relation to the course provision of Applied Learning courses. The Government reserves the right to refuse or terminate any institutions to offer Applied Learning courses, as appropriate. Related disclaimer is at **Appendix III**.
