It also aims at enriching students' English, Chinese and music learning experiences through implementing **Language across the Curriculum**, as well as nurturing **positive values and attitudes** in students.

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Entry Requirements

- open to all **primary and secondary** students in Hong Kong
- a maximum of **THREE** entries
- submitted on an **individual or group basis** (with up to **3 members in each group for the singers**, not including the lyrics writer)

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Rules and Regulations

- write **Chinese or English lyrics** for a song, using ONE of the three commissioned melodies newly composed by the Hong Kong song writer Mr NG Lok-shing Ronald
- **sing the song in Cantonese, Putonghua or English** with the respective **MMO**
- no extra instrumental accompaniment is allowed
- **virtual choir** performance is encouraged for group entries

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The song lyrics should:

- promote positive values and attitudes, e.g. "Perseverance", "Respect for Others", "Responsibility", "National Identity", "Commitment", "Integrity", "Care for Others", "Law-abidingness", "Empathy" and "Diligence";
- include a quotable line that can highlight the key message of the song, e.g. "Seize every opportunity", "The best is yet to come", underlined in the submission;
- display creativity in the use of language; and
- show an understanding of song structure, e.g. verse and chorus.

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Intellectual Property Rights

- All entries should be original and have not been released or publicised; and
 - Participants need to ensure that the content of the entries does not infringe any copyright and publication rights.
- Please visit the website of Intellectual Property Department.
 - Any entries that infringed any intellectual property rights would NOT be accepted. The EDB takes no liability whatsoever for such infringement.
 - The EDB retains the right to edit, modify, publish and use any entries in any forms for display and educational purposes, and has the final decision of the above actions.

- content and **message** of the song
- **language used** in the lyrics
- **performance techniques**
- **musicality** of the performance including expression, interpretation and ensembleship (applicable for group entries only)
- **creativity and originality** of the performance

SOW

- a) content and message of the song

- c) **musicality** of the performance including expression, interpretation and ensembleship (applicable for group entries only)
- d) **performance techniques**
- e) creativity and originality of the performance

CAP

- a) content and message of the song;
- b) language used in the lyrics;
- c) **performance techniques**;
- d) **musicality** of the performance including expression, interpretation and ensembleship (applicable for group entries only); and
- e) creativity and originality of the performance.



Musicality and **performance techniques** are different in its substance.

Musicality means the interpretation and emotions being displayed and conveyed in a music performance; while **performance techniques** are the skills required to make music.

In reality, a music performance can be very emotional but lack of technical accuracy; while another music performance can be technically "perfect" but without much emotion.

Generally speaking, **performance techniques** are objective and measurable, e.g. accuracy of rhythm and pitches; while **musicality** is more subjective towards the emotional aspect. This is why many people think music is very subjective because of the latter. However, music also has its objective aspect.

If a music performance places too much focus on the **performance techniques**, it will be like a robot; if "**musicality**" is exaggerated or unnatural, it will be too vulgar. Hence, striking the balance between musicality and techniques is of utmost important, and **it is the ART.**
