

What is task-based learning?

In task-based learning, a lesson or unit is designed to help learners to **complete a task**: for example; write a letter, make a reservation, plan a trip, collaborate to design something, or hold a meeting.

In task-based learning the language content is defined, not by a grammar syllabus, but by what learners need to complete the task. The tasks themselves can reflect real-life situations. Because it is closely linked to learners' real needs, task-based learning can be highly motivating for learners and extremely useful.




