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Preface

This Activity Booklet is developed by the English Language Education Section, Curriculum Development Institute, Education Bureau, to facilitate and complement the use of the English animation series "An Inspiring Journey through Chinese Fables and Tales", support the learning and teaching of English Language at the primary level, enrich students' English learning experiences, and promote national education. The English animation series together with this Activity Booklet feature three well-known Chinese fables and tales, namely "Fanning the Pillow and Warming the Quilt", "One Rice, Thousand Gold" and "Yu the Great Tamed the Waters". In addition to developing English language skills, students are guided to respect, appreciate and inherit Chinese culture and traditional values, including placing emphasis on filial piety, having gratitude, being perseverant, and upholding the love for our country, thus cultivating a sense of national identity in them.

Aims of the Activity Booklet

This booklet aims to:

- provide suggestions on how to use the animations effectively in different stages of learning and teaching;
- develop students' language skills through viewing the animations;
- foster students' development of proper values and attitudes;
- guide students to respect, appreciate and inherit Chinese culture and traditional values; and
- cultivate in students a sense of belonging to our country, an affection for the nation and a sense of national identity.

Suggested Levels

Key Stages 1 and 2 (Primary 1 to 6)

Content of the Activity Booklet

The Activity Booklet consists of three sets of learning and teaching materials developed for the English animation series "An Inspiring Journey through Chinese Fables and Tales". Each set of materials comprises pre-viewing, while-viewing and post-viewing activities, including making predictions, comprehension, sequencing, speaking and writing tasks, as well as tasks that help students reflect on the lessons learnt and encourage them to practise the proper values and attitudes in their daily life. Students will be inspired by the famous Chinese figures featured in the animations (i.e. Huang Xiang, Han Xin and Yu the Great) and cultivate in them a sense of national identity. Teachers may make use of the scripts provided at the end of the Activity Booklet to facilitate students' understanding of the stories.

Using the English animation series and the Activity Booklet

Schools are encouraged to make effective use of the English animation series and the Activity Booklet to enrich students' English learning experiences, guide them to follow the examples of the ancient role models in the stories, and inspire them to love and care for the family, the community and the country. The stories can be integrated into the relevant modules and units in the school English Language curriculum as appropriate, e.g. "**People who Help us**" and "**Me and my Family**" at KS1, "**Families**" and "**Special People**" at KS2. Teachers are encouraged to select and adapt the materials to suit their students' needs, interests and abilities. Students are encouraged to view the animations in their free time for self-learning and enjoyment. They are also encouraged to apply their learning from the animation series, share the splendid Chinese culture with friends of different cultural backgrounds and tell well the stories of China in English.
