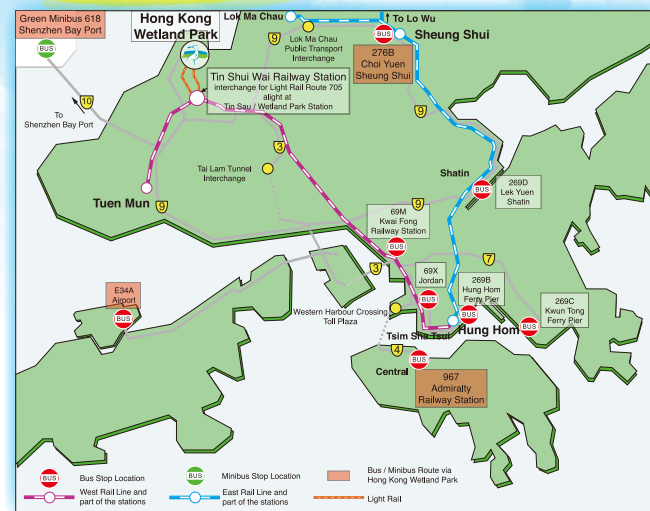


## How to get there?

Closed on Tuesdays (except Public Holidays)

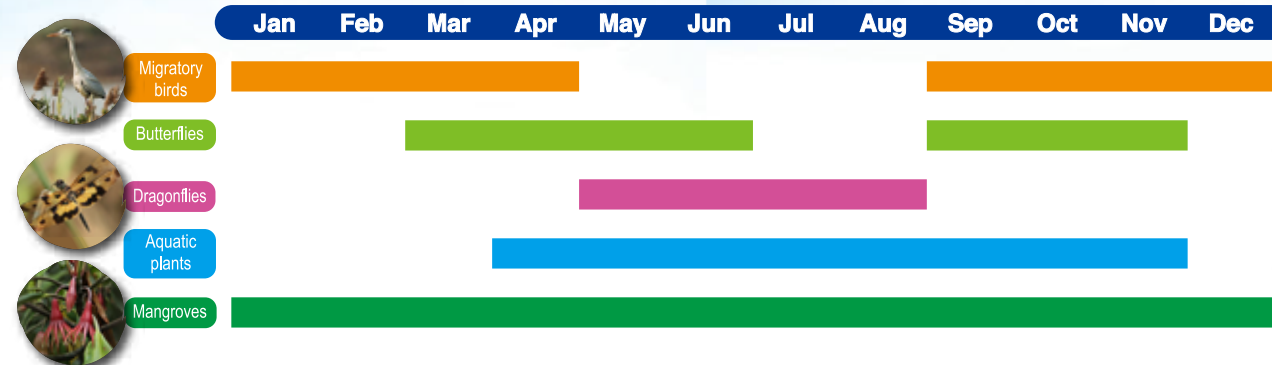
### Admission Fees

## Wonders of Nature

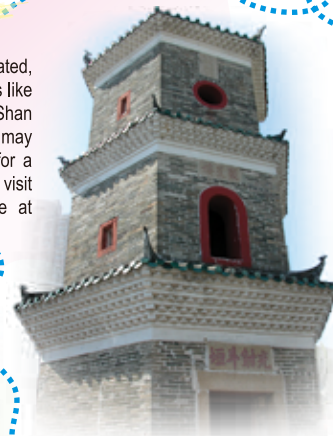
The Wetland Park attracts different animals all year round, with enchanting flowers blossom in spring and summer.

The floating Boardwalk takes visitors close to the interesting intertidal animals.



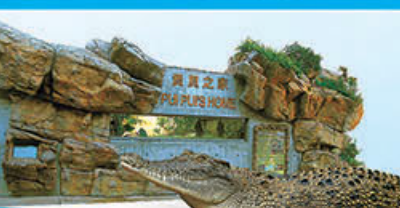
**Bird Hides at Riverside, Fishpond and Mudflat**
