1. You are going to write part of a play. Before you write the play, read the passage below.



Tim, Mary and Sally find Chris very annoying. Mary and Sally tell Chris to stop being so bossy but he does not listen to them. Tim wants to play a trick on Chris but Mary and Sally do not think it is a nice thing to do.

Chris loves eating chocolate but usually gets sick from eating too much of it. Just as Tim, Mary and Sally are sharing a tube of chocolates, Chris comes up to them and grabs it. He eats them all and becomes very sick. He asks Tim, Mary and Sally to help him. However, they do not help him right away. Instead, they ask him not to be so bossy any more. Finally, Chris makes a promise to change his behaviour.
