A Visit to a Zoo

Task Description

In this listening activity, students listened to a conversation between Mary and John about the visit to the zoo. They then took some notes for Mary.

Preparation


Before the listening activity, the teacher oriented the students to the topic by eliciting their prior knowledge and personal experience of visiting a zoo. The teacher also helped them revise related vocabulary items such as 'sandwiches', 'cap' and 'camera'.

twenty-second of April.

Mary: Is it the twenty-second or the twenty-third?

John: Yes, tomorrow is the twenty-third.* (5-second pause)

Mary: What time will we meet?

John: Let's meet at nine o'clock in the morning. We'll stay there for three hours

and leave at twelve.* (5-second pause)

Mary: Where will we meet?

John: At the entrance of the zoo.

Mary: Alright. Do we need to bring our lunch?

John: My uncle and I will bring some chicken wings, fish balls and fruit salad.

What about you?

Mary: I'll bring some sandwiches and a bottle of water. Mm... I'll bring my

camera too.* (10-second pause)

John: It's sunny. I think you'll also need a cap.

Mary: That's a good idea.* (5-second pause)

Mary: How will you get there?

John: I'll get there by bus and my uncle will get there by mini-bus.

Mary: I'll get there by MTR.* (5-second pause)

Mary: By the way, what's your uncle's mobile phone number?

John: Seven-one-two-three-five-six-seven-nine.

Mary: 7-1-2-3-5-6-7-9.* (5-second pause)

Mary: Right. I'll write it down.

John: See you tomorrow.

Mary: See you.

Narrator: That's the end of the listening task.

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
