

LPF Speaking Exemplar

Fashion and Style

Task Description

Students worked in pairs to design outfits which were to be modelled by other classmates in the 'Inter-class Fashion Show'. They first studied some photos taken from fashion magazines, and then discussed the models' appearance and their background from the way they were dressed.

Preparation

In the textbook unit 'Style File', students were introduced to different vocabulary items related to fashion, e.g. names of clothing items, patterns and styles.

Before the discussion, the teacher displayed a few pictures of pop stars and used a mind map to guide them to generate and organise ideas about the pop stars' appearance. Then the teacher distributed the photos from the fashion magazine and asked students to discuss:

- the model's hair style;
- the model's pose;
- the way he/she was dressed; and
- the general impression of the model.
