My Good Friend

Task Description

Students wrote a short descriptive text about their good friends. They described their good friends, wrote about what they did together and how they felt about their friends.

Preparation

Before writing about their friends, students read a text which described the happy and unhappy times of two good friends, Ann and Tom. Some guiding questions were also provided to help students organise and present relevant ideas logically in paragraphs.

- Who is your good friend?
- Why do you think he/she is your good friend?
- What do you usually do together?
- Write about something your friend did for you.
- Did you have any happy or unhappy times with your friend? Write something about it.
- How do you feel about having such a friend?
