## **Task Description**

Students created an illustrated short story about the journey of a water droplet based on the concept of the water cycle. They described the feelings of the water droplet in its different states in a simple story.

## **Preparation**

Before creating the short story, students learnt the concept of the water cycle and the use of water in the General Studies lessons. They also participated in some reading activities such as reading a storybook and some poems about water. Their teacher then guided them to develop a concept map to describe the feelings of a water droplet in its different states in a creative short story.
