Enhancing learning and teaching via e-assessment

Mr Kwok Man Chiu of Christian & Missionary Alliance Sun Kei Primary School uses cloud-based software to design and implement e-assessment in General Studies for Primary Schools. In addition to the provision of instant feedback on students' work and lesson performance through the on-line interactive discussion platform, Mr Kwok also makes use of the platform to introduce self-assessment and peer assessment in different stages of learning.






Assessment rubrics.

Mr Kwok uses online quizzes and the "flipped classroom" strategy to assess students' mastery of the basic knowledge and facts of the learning unit before the start of the first lesson. The assessment results help inform teachers how to plan future lessons – for example, whether to cover the basics again or to move directly to in-depth discussion.



Mr Kwok also encourages his students to chat and discuss their learning on the online platform. Mr Kwok says that observing his students' dialogues help him gain a better understanding of their learning.
