Student's presentation of the pre-lesson task	Teacher invites some students to present their findings about the population growth comparison between China and India. Other students take notes in the lesson worksheet. Teacher invites some students to present their findings after discussion on the given questions. Changes in family planning policy	Teacher leads students to read Figure 2.5 which shows the population age structure in 1982, 2000 and 2020. Ask students how the age structure changes throughout these periods.
