Theme 12 Medical and Social Care Professions

Major characteristics of a profession

- **Training**
 - expertise and professional skills acquired from the recognised academic qualification and training that may be certified in an examination
- **Regulation**
 - the practice regulated by the relevant ordinance(s) and code of practice based on the professional ethics and standards
- **Professional association**
 - the society or association established by own professionals, which has the authority to establish, review and monitor the qualifications of its members

Chinese Medicine Practitioners	Bachelor degree in Traditional Chinese Medicine	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Diagnose and treat patients, using the theory of traditional Chinese medicine to diagnose symptoms through inspection, listening & smelling, inquiring and palpation. Professional Ethics

- Privacy / confidentiality

- not to disclose the information about the clients without his/her consent
- to respect the privacy of the residents in the residential care by providing the private space

- Equality

- to serve all clients equally irrespective of race, nationality, belief, age, gender or social status etc.

Professional Ethics

- **Support and advocacy**

- to support clients in participation in planning and implementation of services
- to advocate initiatives / services for improving the health and well-being of the clients

- **Client-centred / Respect**

- to respect the clients and assist them in making decisions
- to share information and collaborate with the service users to meet a mutual agreement of a treatment plan/ solution
- to provide more user friendly services, e.g. online booking system
- to put the interest of the clients on the top of the priority
