Time Arrangement for OLE Implementation

Building on the strengths and experiences of the school has already had, due consideration should be given to the suggested modes of implementation for each area of OLE. For example,

- Aesthetic Development and Physical Development can be largely implemented in the form of structured lessons which are already available in many schools.
- Moral and Civic Education is commonly provided in class teacher periods, assemblies, specifically assigned lessons and other events outside classroom to develop positive values. Initiatives such as life-skills education, character education, ethics and religious education could be part of Moral and Civic Education.
- Career-related Experiences and Community Service could be arranged after school, during post-examination time, weekends or school holidays if required.
