

Title of School-based Support Service (2026/27):
Quality Education Fund Thematic Network projects (QTN projects) –
Enhance Assessment Literacy through the Design of Quality Assignments

1. Objectives

The support service aims to:

- enhance curriculum leadership and professional level of teaching team for participating schools through train-the-trainer approach and with a focus on nurturing curriculum leaders
- assist participating schools in understanding the functions and significance of various assignment types, and planning diverse and effective assignments that cater for learner diversity
- review the assignment designs and assessment literacy of the Chinese Language and English Language subjects of participating schools, and provide school-based recommendations, while strengthening the connection between assignment designs and assessment with reference to the school contexts and needs
- support participating schools in utilising various assessment methods, including Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools, to understand and evaluate student learning outcomes comprehensively
- deepen teachers' understanding of “quality assignments” and “assessment literacy”, thereby enhancing their abilities to design diverse learning tasks and building the assessment capacity of the teaching teams
- establish a cross-school professional networking platform to enhance teachers' confidence and ability in designing effective assignments

2. Foci of Support

- To provide various support services, including thematic seminars, teacher workshops and on-site co-planning sessions
- To organise professional school communities to facilitate mutual support and experience sharing among schools
- To analyse the current status and needs of participating schools, provide assistance in developing distinctive school-based curricula and assignment designs (Chinese Language and English Language subjects only)
- To establish a learning & teaching and assignment resource bank to promote resource sharing
- To incorporate relevant elements of values education into assignment design, based on school needs
- To organise professional development activities for teachers, inter-school exchange on quality assignments, and an year-end territory-wide dissemination seminar

3. Modes of Support

- QTN coordinator will support and collaborate with teachers of participating schools, details are as follows:

On-site collaboration and networking activities	At least 19 times of on-site support and networking activities <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The core teaching team participates in cross-school professional development activities, sharing and promoting effective practices and resources to facilitate professional exchanges among schools• Conduct in-depth analysis of schools' needs and carry out a range of lesson-study activities – including curriculum planning, collaborative lesson planning, on-site workshops, lesson observation and post-lesson discussions to enhance teacher professionalism through close exchange• Organise professional development activities, such as teacher meetings and thematic seminars• Develop school-based curricula (Chinese Language and English Language subjects only) and create teaching resources for sharing, such as lesson plans and learning & teaching materials• Encourage professional exchange through inter-school exchange of assignment design and year-end territory-wide dissemination seminar
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4. Points to note

- The duration of the support services normally lasts for one year
- Participating schools are expected to actively participate throughout the support services
- At least one representative should attend each QTN activity
- To fully utilise the support services, participating schools should:
 - nominate panel heads / related teachers to coordinate QTN activities
 - arrange regular timeslots for teachers to collaborate and exchange, e.g. periods for collaborative lesson planning and lesson observation
 - arrange teachers to participate in one Preparation Meeting, two Executive Committee (EC) meetings and a territory-wide dissemination seminar to share their successful experiences in school curriculum development and the learning and teaching materials developed under collaboration
- Allow support officers to collect materials including video clips and photographs of learning activities, teachers' reflection and student work during the support period for professional discussion
- Encourage the core teaching team to disseminate successful experiences in school curriculum development and the learning and teaching resources co-developed within and across schools (The copyright of these materials will be owned by Quality Education Fund.
