

Title of School-based Support Service (2026/27):
Quality Education Fund Thematic Network projects (QTN projects) –
Enhancing School Management’s Professional Capability to Lead the Teaching
Team in Conducting School Self-evaluation

1. Objectives

The support service aims to:

- enhance curriculum leadership and professional level of teaching team for participating schools through train-the-trainer approach and with a focus on nurturing curriculum leaders
- (at school level) strengthen schools’ literacy in data use and evaluation, and guide them to make good use of the self-evaluation tools provided by the Education Bureau and school-based evaluation data to formulate development plans that are evidence-based, align with the seven learning goals and focus on student learning outcomes
- (at teacher level) assist school leaders in leading their teaching teams to build consensus and implement the “Planning–Implementation–Evaluation (P-I-E)” self-evaluation cycle in an evidence-based manner
- connect coordinating school with participating schools to establish a professional learning community for inter-school collaboration and peer learning, so as to enhance the effectiveness of school self-evaluation in facilitating sustainable development of schools
- (at student level) promote school development plans that focus on student learning outcomes, thereby enhancing their learning effectiveness

2. Foci of Support

- To lead school teams in conducting an in-depth analysis of the current situation of their schools using various tools and jointly formulating their first-stage self-evaluation action plan
- To lead teachers to practice data analysis using real data from their schools as examples, and transforming data into actions
- To collaborate with school teams to design self-evaluation processes, tools, and reporting mechanisms that suit their specific school contexts
- To invite participating schools to sit in the meetings and lessons of the coordinating school to experience how a mature reflective learning community operates, while providing on-site guidance
- To facilitate the exchange among schools within the network, allowing principals and teachers to learn from one another, broaden their horizons, and reflect for continuous improvement; establish a school management exchange platform for principals and middle managers of participating schools to share leadership strategies and practical insights in change management

3. Modes of Support

- QTN coordinator will support and collaborate with teachers of participating schools, details are as follows:

<p>On-site collaboration and networking activities</p>	<p>At least 17 times of on-site support and networking activities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Arrange professionals and coordinating school personnel to conduct school visits at participating schools, thereby providing assistance and guidance in the use of self-evaluation tools, the analysis and application of data to inform planning, as well as the implementation of the directions and plans for the new cycle ● The core teaching team participates in cross-school professional development activities, sharing and promoting effective practices and resources to facilitate professional exchanges among schools ● Conduct professional development activities, including thematic seminars for teachers, joint lesson preparation, lesson observation, and post-observation feedback, open classrooms and inter-school visits ● Assist schools in formulating Annual School Plans by “making use of the evaluation to inform planning” ● Engage in cross-school exchange during inter-school visits and territory-wide sharing sessions
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4. Points to note

- The duration of the support services normally lasts for one year.
- Participating schools are expected to actively participate in the QTN activities, and lead the core teaching team to participate in this professional support service; to be responsible for liaising with the relevant support officers and making specific arrangements for the support service
- At least one representative should attend each QTN activity.
- To fully utilise the support services, participating schools should:
 - nominate a dedicated teacher to coordinate QTN activities
 - arrange regular timeslots to collaborate and exchange, e.g. periods for collaborative lesson planning and lesson observation
 - assign teachers to attend at least 2 training workshops and 11 networking activities
 - arrange teachers to participate in one Preparation Meeting, two Executive Committee (EC) meetings and a territory-wide dissemination seminar to share their successful experiences in school curriculum development and the learning and teaching materials developed under collaboration

- Allow support officers to collect materials including video clips and photographs of learning activities, teachers' reflection and student work during the support period for professional discussion
- Encourage the core teaching team to disseminate successful experiences in school curriculum development and the learning and teaching resources co-developed within and across schools (The copyright of these materials will be owned by Quality Education Fund.
