Kindergarten Subsidy Scheme 2005/2006 School Year

Summary

This circular memorandum is to inform kindergarten supervisors the details on the application for the Government subsidy under the Kindergarten Subsidy Scheme (KSS) in the 2005/2006 school year. The deadline for submission of such applications is 22 March 2005. It also announces the group/per capita grant rate for the 2005/2006 school year.

Details

- 2. To be eligible to stay in or join the KSS in the 2005/2006 school year, a kindergarten must be non-profit-making charging fee at a level not higher than \$21,100 per pupil per annum for half-day session in the 2004/2005 school year.
- 3. Kindergartens wishing to stay in or join the KSS in the 2005/2006 school year should complete and return the attached "Kindergarten Subsidy Scheme 2005/2006 School Year Proforma on Enrolment/QKTs Attainment" at Annex 1, together with their fee revision application to their School Development Officer by **22 March 2005**. Kindergartens wishing to join the KSS for the first time or rejoin the KSS should also complete and return the "Kindergarten Subsidy Scheme Application Form" attached to Education and Manpower Bureau Circular No. 6/2002.
- 4. The rate of group subsidy for the 2005/2006 school year in line with the movement of the Consumer Price Index (A) remains the same as the 2004/2005 school year as follows:

- 5. All kindergartens are required to employ 100% QKTs in the required teaching staff establishment, calculated on a teacher to pupil ratio of 1:15. As the group grant on special arrangement will have been completely phased out in the 2005/2006 school year, the group grant on normal arrangement will apply to all kindergartens participating in the KSS for all levels as from the 2005/2006 school year.
- 6. This Circular Memorandum should be read in conjunction with Education and Manpower Bureau Circular No. 6/2002 on "Kindergarten Subsidy Scheme".
