## **Air Quality Health Index**

The Environmental Protection Department (EPD) will launch the Air Quality Health Index (AQHI) to replace the existing Air Pollution Index (API) on 30 December 2013 for better communication of the air quality information and the associated health risks to the public. Details of the AQHI and the relevant health advice can be accessed at the EPD's website: www.aqhi.gov.hk/en.html.

To tie in with the launching of the AQHI, related sections of the Education Bureau (EDB) will update the relevant parts of their existing guidelines on the EDB webpage by the end of 2013 (including the Reference Materials on Physical Activities in Kindergartens, the Safety Guidelines on Physical Education Key Learning Area for Hong Kong Schools and the Guidelines on Outdoor Activities). Meanwhile, we have posted the following highlights on the EDB webpage (www.edb.gov.hk > School Administration and Management > Administration > About Activities > School Activities Guidelines) for reference of schools:

- Dos and Don'ts for Arranging School Activities (Applicable to Kindergartens); and
- Dos and Don'ts for Arranging Physical Activities (Applicable to Primary and Secondary Schools).

Schools should maintain good communication with parents and keep them informed of the arrangement of school activities when the health risk reaches different levels.
