Arrangements for Basic Law and National Security Law Test in the 2025/26 school year

Summary

This circular memorandum informs all public sector schools¹, Direct Subsidy Scheme schools (DSS schools), and kindergartens/kindergarten-cum-child care centres and schools with kindergarten classes joining the Kindergarten Education Scheme (hereinafter collectively referred to as “Scheme-KGs”) of the arrangements for the Basic Law and National Security Law Test (BLNST) in the 2025/26 school year and remind schools to verify and submit newly-appointed teachers’ BLNST information. This circular memorandum should be read in conjunction with the Education Bureau (EDB) Circular No. 13/2022 “Requirement for Newly-appointed Teachers to Pass the Basic Law and National Security Law Test” issued on 24 October 2022 and EDB’s letter to schools in May 2023.

Background

2. The words and deeds of teachers have a far-reaching impact on students’ growth. Teachers should have a correct understanding of the Basic Law and the National Security Law so that they can enlighten students by helping them fulfill responsibilities as a national and Hong Kong resident with a positive, law-abiding, public interest-oriented and responsible attitude. As announced in the EDB Circular No. 13/2022 “Requirement for Newly-appointed Teachers to Pass the Basic Law and National Security Law Test”, starting from the 2023/24 school year, all newly-appointed teachers in public sector schools, DSS schools and Scheme-KGs (including newly-joined teachers and teachers changing schools) are required to pass the BLNST

in order to be considered for appointment. Schools should require teachers to have a correct understanding of the Basic Law and the National Security Law and encourage teachers to take the relevant test. For details of the requirement, please refer to the EDB webpage (<https://www.edb.gov.hk/en/blnst>).

Details

3. In view of the launch of Digitalised BLNST (Degree/Professional Grades) by Civil Service Bureau (CSB) (hereinafter referred to as the Digitalised BLNST) and the significant decline in demand for taking the BLNST (non-degree level), to optimise the utilization of resources, EDB will no longer organise BLNST (degree level) but will continue to organise one round of BLNST (non-degree level) starting from the 2025/26 school year. Specific arrangements are as follows:

BLNST at degree level

4. CSB has launched the Digitalised BLNST in May 2025 for persons who possess a bachelor's degree or will have attained a bachelor's degree in the current or next academic year to take the BLNST (Degree / Professional Grades) at their own selected timeslots throughout the year. In this regard, teachers can take the Digitalised BLNST according to their needs and schedules starting from the 2025/26 school year. The examination format, duration and content of the Digitalised BLNST are identical to the past paper-based BLNST (degree level) organised by the EDB. Candidates will also receive their test results in the form of electronic result certificates on the same day of the test. Teachers who possess a pass result in the BLNST issued by CSB will be deemed to have met the relevant requirement and can be considered for appointment.

5. Please note that applicant who is absent from the test or has not attained a pass result in the test will not be allowed to take the Digitalised BLNST again during the three-month suspension period. EDB encourages teachers to take the test as early as possible. BLNST at non-degree level

6. EDB will continue to organise paper-based BLNST (non-degree level) for persons without a bachelor's degree and plan to join or change to another secondary schools, primary schools to take up non-graduate teaching posts or be a teacher in kindergartens. The test is tentatively scheduled for 7 June 2026 (Sunday). Details and application arrangements of the test will be announced through press release and EDB webpage in mid-April 2026.

7. A pass result in BLNST (non-degree level) is only applicable for applying for non-graduate teaching posts. For those who have passed the BLNST (non-degree level) and subsequently attained a degree qualification and wish to apply for graduate

teaching posts, they will be required to take the BLNST (degree level) to meet the relevant requirement. Individual schools may contact EDB if non-graduate teachers to be appointed were unable to take the previous BLNST (non-degree level) organised by EDB before the appointment is effective and require special arrangements, EDB will render appropriate support on a case-by-case basis.

Verify and submit newly-appointed teachers' BLNST information

8. Public sector schools, DSS schools and Scheme-KGs are required to verify teachers' prior attainment of a pass result in the BLNST issued by EDB, CSB or government departments before the appointment is effective and submit the BLNST information of all newly-appointed teachers to EDB through the e-Services Portal (<https://eservices.edb.gov.hk>) at the beginning of each school year. For details, please refer to EDB's letter to schools in May 2023.

9. When verifying relevant information provided by the newly-appointed teachers, schools may accept the printed copy of the pass result of the BLNST issued by EDB, CSB, or government departments, and also the printed version of the electronic result certificate issued by CSB. The electronic result certificate contains an e-Proof QR code and schools can access the e-Proof website (www.eproof.gov.hk) and scan the e-Proof QR code by using the built-in scanner to verify the validity of the electronic result certificate. The verification result of the electronic result certificate will be shown in a frame with different colours, i.e. "Verified" (In Green) or "Revoked" (In Red) respectively.
