



EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES IN HONG KONG

INTRODUCTION

In Hong Kong, children between the ages of three and five could receive kindergarten education at kindergartens which are privately run. The Government provides 12 years' free primary and secondary education to all children through public sector schools, which form the majority in the school system. These consist of government schools operated directly by the Government and aided schools that are generally run by religious or charitable organisations. Eligible children from the age of six, irrespective of sex, ethnic origin, religious or ethical belief, family status and physical or mental ability, have the right to enjoy basic education in public sector schools. To meet the different needs of students, there are other types of schools, namely Direct Subsidy Scheme schools and self-financed private schools. Starting from the 2008/09 school year, the Government has provided full subvention for full-time programmes offered by the Vocational Training Council (VTC) for Secondary 3 school leavers, making available an alternative free avenue for students to further their studies other than through mainstream education.

The three-year senior secondary curriculum under the New Academic Structure has been implemented in Secondary 4 since September 2009, leading to one public examination at the end of Secondary 6 - the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination which replaces the former Hong Kong Certificate of Education

Examination (HKCEE) and Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination (HKALE).

The Government's language policy is to enable students to be biliterate (to master written Chinese and English) and trilingual (to speak fluent Cantonese, Putonghua and English). Chinese and English are taught as core subjects in primary and secondary schools. While Chinese is the medium of instruction (MOI) in most primary schools, secondary schools have implemented the fine-tuned MOI arrangements from the 2010/11 school year. The MOI arrangements of secondary schools have hence become diversified with Chinese and English as the MOI within and across schools to meet the ability and learning needs of students and to increase their exposure to, and use of, English so as to prepare them for future studies and careers.

The Government ensures equal opportunities in school admission for all eligible children (including non-Chinese speaking (NCS) children) in public sector schools, regardless of their races. The Education Bureau (EDB) provides various education services for NCS students and supports the work of school administrators, teachers and parents. Parents of NCS children are encouraged to arrange for their children to study in schools with an immersed Chinese language environment as early as possible to facilitate their mastery of the Chinese language. The Government has also put in place various support measures for NCS students to help them adapt to the local education system,

SUPPORT SERVICES FOR NEW ARRIVALS

To render timely and appropriate support to newly arrived children for them to integrate smoothly into the local education system and wider community, the EDB has been providing school placement services to these children after their arrival in Hong Kong. They can choose to enroll into a full-time six-month Initiation Programme prior to their entry to mainstream schools. For those who choose to enter mainstream schools directly, the EDB has commissioned non-governmental organisations (NGOs) to operate a part-time 60-hour Induction Programme for them. Public sector schools (referring to government, aided and caput schools) and schools under the Direct Subsidy Scheme (DSS), admitting these children will also be provided with a School-based Support Scheme (SBSS) Grant to operate school-based support programmes for them.

Initiation Programme

Some schools run full-time 6-month Initiation Programme for newly arrived children. The programme provides these students with real classroom experience so as to enhance their Chinese and English language standards, help them adjust to the local society and foster their personal development. Placement assistance to mainstream schools is provided after completing the programme. Induction Programme

The EDB also invites NGOs to run a 60-hour Induction Programme for newly arrived children. The programme contents include knowing the environment, basic learning skills and basic Chinese and English. Further details are also available at the EDB website:

School-based Support Scheme Grant

To help newly arrived children to cope with the learning environment in local schools, the EDB provides public sector schools and DSS schools with the SBSS Grant. Schools can flexibly make use of the grant to run school-based support programmes (e.g. supplementary language classes) for the children.

Placement Service

Our school system is open to all students, including NCS students. KINDERGARTEN EDUCATION

Among the 1 049 kindergartens in the 2019/20 school year, around 160 are offering non-local curriculum. However, NCS children are encouraged to enroll in local kindergartens, which use Chinese as the medium of instruction, to facilitate their integration into the community as early as possible. Some kindergartens

operating with an attached child care centre (kindergarten-cum-child care centres) also provide child care services for children aged below 3.

The Government has implemented the new kindergarten education scheme (Scheme) starting from the 2017/18 school year. The policy objectives are to provide good quality and highly affordable kindergarten education, and enhance the accessibility of students to different modes of services that suit their specific needs. Needy families may apply for financial assistance in the form of fee remission under the Kindergarten and Child Care Centre Fee Remission Scheme (KCFRS) for their children who are attending kindergartens under the Scheme. In addition to fee remission, needy families may apply for the Grant for School-related Expenses for Kindergarten Students. Applicants who can pass the means test and meet the same eligibility criteria under the KCFRS are eligible for the grant to defray school-related expenses

incurred from the students' kindergarten education under the Scheme. For details, parents can visit

PRIMARY EDUCATION

Among the public sector primary schools, almost all of them are using Chinese as the medium of instruction, with English taught as a core subject from Primary 1. NCS children are encouraged to enroll in local primary schools, to facilitate their integration into the community as early as possible.

Some primary schools in Hong Kong are offering language subjects other than Chinese and English. List of schools is given at **Annex III**.

SECONDARY EDUCATION

Starting with Secondary 1 level from the 2010/11 school year onwards, all the existing public sector secondary schools have been given greater flexibility in enriching their English learning environment by introducing different MOI arrangements to suit different needs of their students.

All eligible Primary 6 students can be allocated a subsidised Secondary 1 place through the Secondary School Places Allocation System. They can also choose to apply for admission to schools joining the Direct Subsidy Scheme, private schools and international schools direct.

SUPPORT FOR NCS STUDENTS' LEARNING OF THE CHINESE LANGUAGE

The Government is committed to encouraging and supporting the integration of NCS students into the community, including facilitating their early adaptation to the local education system and mastery of the Chinese language. EDB has, starting from the 2014/15 school year, implemented the “Chinese Language Curriculum Second Language Learning Framework” (“Learning Framework”), which was drawn up in consultation with teachers and language experts, in primary and secondary schools to help NCS students learn Chinese as a second language. Besides, starting from the 2014/15 school year, Applied Learning Chinese (for non-Chinese speaking students) (ApL(C)) has been introduced at the senior secondary levels to provide NCS students with an additional channel to obtain an alternative Chinese language qualification to prepare them for further studies and career pursuits. In addition to the HKDSE qualification, ApL(C) is also pegged at the Qualifications Framework Levels 1-3. ApL(C) is accepted for admission to Universities Grants Committee-funded universities and most post-secondary institutions, as well as appointments to the Civil Service.

Support for schools admitting NCS students

To facilitate schools' implementation of the “Learning Framework” and creation of an inclusive learning environment in schools, EDB has substantially increased the funding to schools, and provided schools with teaching resources, teacher training and

professional support. The additional funding allows schools to adopt diversified intensive learning and teaching modes (including pull-out learning, split-class/group learning, after-school consolidation, etc.) as appropriate according to the learning needs of their NCS students.

Chinese Language Learning Support Centre

Individual NCS students may join the remedial courses after school or during holidays conducted by the Chinese Language Learning Support Centre (the Centre). There are around 20 venues in the 2020/21 school year. Apart from running the support programme for NCS students, the Centre also assists in the organisation of professional development workshops to render support to teachers and parents of NCS students.

Summer Bridging Programme

The EDB has invited some schools to run a 4-week Bridging Programme since 2004 for NCS Primary 1 entrants allocated centrally through the Primary One Admission System to local mainstream schools. Starting from the summer of 2007, the 4-week Summer Bridging Programme originally confined to incoming Primary 1 entrants has been extended to cover also NCS students proceeding to Primary 2, Primary 3 and Primary 4 in order to help them consolidate what they have learnt at Key Learning Stage 1 and prepare them for transition to Key Learning Stage 2. Public sector schools and DSS schools offering local curriculum with the relevant NCS students are invited each year to operate the Programme with funding support by the Government. Starting from 2013, NCS parents are encouraged to join the Programme with their children to promote parental support to NCS students learning the Chinese Language and home-school cooperation.

STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

All eligible children with special educational needs (SEN) have the right to enjoy equal opportunity to receive education in public sector schools in Hong Kong. Subject to the assessment and recommendations of the specialists and with parental consent, children (including NCS children) with more severe or multiple disabilities are placed in special schools for intensive support. Other children with SEN will attend ordinary schools. The EDB provides both ordinary and special schools with additional resources, teacher training and professional support to strengthen their support to students with SEN, including NCS students with SEN.

Starting from the 2019/20 school year, the EDB has implemented a series of enhancement measures on integrated education (IE) in public sector ordinary schools. The enhanced measures include restructuring various subvented programmes for IE with the Learning Support Grant extended to all schools, increasing the grant rate for tier-3 support and provision of additional regular teaching posts; upgrading the post of special educational needs coordinator to a promotion rank in schools with a comparatively large number of students with SEN; extending further the Enhanced School-based Educational Psychology Service; and enhancing the School-based Speech Therapy Service. To further help NCS students with SEN to adjust to school life and make smooth transition through different learning stages, the EDB also provides eligible public sector ordinary schools and DSS schools with the Grant for Supporting NCS students with SEN on top of the existing provisions.

For special schools, apart from teaching staff, the EDB provides them with related multi-disciplinary specialist staff according to the learning needs of

students. The specialist staff include school social workers, educational psychologists, speech therapists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, nurses, braillists, etc. Besides, various additional grants, such as Top-up Fund for procuring special furniture and equipment or carrying out minor conversion works for students, intensive support grant for employing additional teaching assistants, and additional support grant for enhancing the support for students with medical complexity, are in place so as to enable special schools to address the students' special needs. Some aided special schools also offer boarding service to cater for the long-term residential needs of students and hence facilitate their schooling during school days.

The English Schools Foundation (ESF)

All ESF schools provide support for mainstream classes and learning support classes for children with special educational needs according to the needs of the children after assessment by the ESF educational psychologist. The children are normally taught in separate groups by

special education teachers for the basic subjects, and are integrated into ordinary class for cultural subjects and general activities whenever possible. Before a child is considered for special education provision in ESF schools, assessment by the ESF educational psychologist is required.

The nine ESF primary schools include Bradbury School, Glenealy School, Kennedy School, Peak School and Quarry Bay School on Hong Kong Island, Beacon Hill School, Clearwater Bay School and Kowloon Junior School in Kowloon and Shatin Junior School in the New Territories for children of primary school age. The five ESF secondary schools include Island School, South Island School and West Island School on Hong Kong Island, King George V School in Kowloon and Shatin College in the New Territories for students of secondary school age. For children requiring more extensive learning and teaching adjustments, Jockey Club Sarah Roe School in Kowloon provides a special curriculum geared to their needs.

MULTIPLE PATHWAYS FOR NCS STUDENTS

Alternative Chinese Language Qualifications

NCS students who have a late start in learning Chinese or have not been given full opportunities to study the local Chinese Language curriculum are subsidised to attain internationally recognised alternative Chinese Language qualifications, including those under the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE), International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) and General Certificate of Education (GCE) for the purpose of facilitating their academic and career advancement. Eligible NCS school candidates entering for the aforesaid non-local Chinese Language examinations are subsidised with the difference between fee levels of these examinations and that of the HKDSE (Chinese Language). Needy NCS students may be granted full or half fee remission of the subsidised examination fees.

Individual University Grants Committee (UGC)-funded universities have set out further details of their requirements, including the alternative Chinese Language qualifications to be accepted and the minimum grading required, as well as any specific requirements of individual undergraduate programmes. For sub-degree programmes, the Updated Revised Common Descriptors for Associate Degree and Higher Diploma Programmes under the New Academic Structure has stipulated that institutions will continue to accept alternative Chinese qualifications for NCS students who have met specified conditions.

Vocational and Professional Education and Training

Some NCS students may be interested in vocational and professional education and training (VPET). The VTC offers a wide range of VPET programmes. All applicants, irrespective of their race or ethnic origin, who are able to meet the admission requirements, will be considered. The VTC mainly uses English as the

medium of instruction for its post-secondary 6 or above level of programmes which may be supplemented with Chinese, if necessary. Where programmes require HKDSE Chinese Language qualification for admission, alternative language qualifications may be considered for NCS applicants. Hence, NCS students may apply to VPET programmes according to their preference. They are the primary service providers of international education services and have traditionally been meeting the demand from NCS students and foreign nationals, most of whom would eventually return to their home countries for education.
