EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES IN HONG KONG

INTRODUCTION

In Hong Kong, children between the ages of three and five could receive kindergarten education at kindergartens which are privately run. The Government provides 12 years of free primary and secondary education to all children through public sector schools, which form the majority in the school system. These consist of government schools operated directly by the Government, and aided and caput schools that are generally run by religious or charitable organisations. Eligible children from the age of six, irrespective of sex, ethnic origin, religious or ethical belief, family status and physical or mental ability, have the right to enjoy basic education in public sector schools. To meet the different needs of students, there are other types of schools, namely Direct Subsidy Scheme (“DSS”) schools and self-financed private schools. Starting from the 2008/09 school year, the Government has provided full subvention for full-time programmes offered by the Vocational Training Council (“VTC”) for Secondary 3 school leavers, making available an alternative free avenue for students to further their studies outside mainstream education.

The three-year senior secondary curriculum under the existing academic structure has been implemented in Secondary 4 since September 2009. Upon completion of Secondary 6, students sit for a public examination, the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (“HKDSE”) Examination.

The Government’s language education policy is to train the younger generation to become biliterate in written Chinese and English and trilingual in Cantonese, Putonghua and

spoken English. Chinese Language (Primary 1-Secondary 6), English Language (Primary 1-Secondary 6), and Putonghua (Primary 1-Secondary 3) are taught as core subjects in primary and secondary schools. The fine-tuned medium of instruction (“MOI”) arrangements for secondary schools have been implemented at junior secondary levels from the 2010/11 school year under which schools have been given the flexibility to plan their school-based MOI arrangements to meet the ability and learning needs of students, thereby providing them with more opportunities to be exposed to and use English in schools progressively in preparation for further studies and work in future.

The Government ensures equal opportunities in school admission for all eligible children (including non-Chinese speaking (“NCS”) children) in public sector schools, regardless of their races. The Education Bureau (“EDB”) provides various education services for NCS students and supports the work of school administrators, teachers and parents. Parents of NCS children are encouraged to arrange for their children to study in schools with an immersed Chinese language environment as early as possible to facilitate their mastery of the Chinese language. SUPPORT SERVICES FOR NEW ARRIVALS

The EDB has been providing newly arrived children (including newly arrived children from the Mainland, newly arrived NCS children and returnee children) with school placement and a series of support services including Initiation Programme and Induction Programme, with a view to helping them better integrate into the local education system and the community. Newly arrived children can choose to enrol into a full-time six-month Initiation Programme prior to their entry to mainstream schools. For those who choose to enter mainstream schools directly, they can attend the 60-hour Induction Programme in parallel. Public sector schools (including government, aided and caput schools) and DSS schools, admitting these children can apply for the School-based Support Scheme (“SBSS”) Grant to provide school-based support services for them.

Initiation Programme

The full-time six-month Initiation Programme run by individual schools provides newly arrived children with real classroom experience so as to enhance their Chinese and English language standards, help them better adjust to the local society and foster their personal development. Placement assistance to mainstream schools is provided after completing the programme. Induction Programme

The EDB invites non-governmental organisations to run a 60-hour Induction Programme for newly arrived children in order to help them adapt to the local social environment and education system. The programme contents include understanding the Hong Kong environment, basic learning skills and basic Chinese and English. Details are available at the EDB website:

School-based Support Scheme Grant

Public sector schools and DSS schools can apply for the SBSS Grant so as to help newly arrived children cope with the learning environment in local schools. Schools can flexibly make use of the grant to provide school-based support services (e.g. supplementary language classes) for the children.

Placement Assistance Service

Our school system is open to all students, including NCS students. KINDERGARTEN EDUCATION

Among the 980 kindergartens in the 2024/25 school year, around 130 are offering non-local curriculum. However, NCS children are encouraged to enroll in local kindergartens, which use Chinese as the MOI, to facilitate their integration into the community as early as possible. Some kindergartens operating with an attached child care centre (“kindergarten-cum-child care centres”) also provide child care services for children aged below 3.

The Government has implemented the Kindergarten Education Scheme starting from the 2017/18 school year. The policy objectives are to provide good quality and highly affordable kindergarten education, and enhance the accessibility of students to different modes of

Needy families passing the means test may apply for financial assistance in the form of fee remission under the Kindergarten and Child Care Centre Fee Remission Scheme (“KCFRS”) for their children who are attending kindergartens under the Kindergarten Education Scheme. In addition to fee remission, needy families may apply for the Grant for School-related Expenses for Kindergarten Students. Applicants who can pass the means test and meet the same eligibility criteria under the KCFRS are eligible for the grant to defray school-related expenses incurred from the students’ kindergarten education under the Kindergarten Education Scheme. PRIMARY EDUCATION

Public sector primary schools generally teach in Chinese. English language is a core subject from Primary 1. Some primary schools in Hong Kong are offering language subjects other than Chinese and English. List of schools is given at [Annex III](#).

SECONDARY EDUCATION

Starting with Secondary 1 level from the 2010/11 school year onwards, all public sector secondary schools have been given greater flexibility in enriching their English learning environment by devising professionally their school-based MOI arrangements to suit different needs of their students.

All eligible Primary 6 students can be allocated a subsidised Secondary 1 place through the Secondary School Places Allocation System. They can also choose to apply for admission to DSS schools, private schools and international schools direct.

SUPPORT FOR NCS STUDENTS’ LEARNING OF THE CHINESE LANGUAGE

The Government is committed to encouraging and supporting the integration of NCS students into the community, including facilitating their early adaptation to the local education system and mastery of the Chinese language. The EDB has, starting from the 2014/15 school year, implemented the “Chinese Language Curriculum Second Language Learning Framework” in primary and secondary schools to help NCS students learn Chinese.

Besides, starting from the 2014/15 school year, Applied Learning Chinese (for non-Chinese speaking students) (“ApL(C)”) has been offered at the senior secondary level as an additional channel for NCS students meeting specified circumstances¹ to obtain an alternative Chinese language qualification and prepare them for further studies and career pursuits. In addition to the HKDSE qualification, it is also pegged at Qualifications Framework Level 1 to Level 3. ApL(C) is accepted for admission to University Grants Committee (“UGC”)-funded universities and most post-secondary institutions as well as appointments to the Civil Service.

¹ Specifically, these NCS students are those who have learned Chinese Language for either –

- (a) less than six years while receiving primary and secondary education; or
- (b) six years or more in schools, but have been taught an adapted and simpler Chinese Language curriculum not normally applicable to the majority of students in local schools.

Support for Schools Admitting NCS Students

The EDB has been providing NCS students with all-encompassing learning support from pre-primary to secondary levels through diverse strategies, including curriculum development, learning and teaching resources, teacher training, professional support, additional funding, multiple pathways, parent education and support for parents, etc., to help NCS students master the Chinese language and integrate into the community.

Summer Bridging Programme for NCS Students

To strengthen the support for NCS students at the primary levels in learning Chinese, the EDB has provided the Summer Bridging Programme through schools for years to facilitate Primary 1 NCS entrants who are about to be admitted to public sector primary schools (including special schools) and primary schools under the DSS to adapt to the use of Chinese in classroom learning, and help NCS students progressing to higher levels of a primary school consolidate what they have learnt in the school year and prepare them for Chinese learning in the following school year.

STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

All eligible children with special educational needs (“SEN”) have the right to enjoy equal opportunity to receive education in public sector schools in Hong Kong. Subject to the assessment and recommendations of specialists and the consent of parents, the EDB refers students (including NCS students) with more severe or multiple disabilities to aided special schools for intensive support services. Other students with SEN will attend ordinary schools. The EDB provides both ordinary and special schools with additional resources, teacher training and professional support to strengthen their support to students with SEN, including NCS students with SEN.

Starting from the 2019/20 school year, the EDB has implemented a series of enhancement measures on integrated education (“IE”) in public sector ordinary schools. The enhanced measures include restructuring various subvented programmes for IE with the Learning Support Grant extended to all public sector ordinary

schools, increasing the grant rate for tier-3 support and provision of additional regular teaching posts; upgrading the post of SEN Coordinator to a promotion rank in schools with a comparatively large number of students with SEN; extending further the Enhanced School-based Educational Psychology Service; and implementing the Enhanced School-based Speech Therapy Service. To further help NCS students with SEN to adjust to school life and make smooth transition through different learning stages, the EDB also provides eligible public sector ordinary schools and DSS schools with the Grant for Supporting NCS students with SEN on top of the existing provisions.

For aided special schools, apart from teaching staff, the EDB provides them with related multi-disciplinary specialist staff according to the learning needs of students. The specialist staff include social workers, educational psychologists, speech therapists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, nurses and braillists. Besides, various additional grants, such as Top-up Fund for procuring special furniture and equipment or carrying out minor conversion works for students, intensive support grant for employing additional teaching assistants, and additional support grant for enhancing the support for students with medical complexity, are in place so as to enable special schools to address the students’ special needs. Some aided special schools also offer boarding service to cater for students with long-term residential needs and hence facilitate their schooling during school days.

The English Schools Foundation (“ESF”)

All ESF schools provide support for mainstream classes and learning support classes for children with SEN according to the needs of the children after assessment by the ESF educational psychologist. The children are normally taught in separate groups by special education teachers for the basic subjects, and are integrated into ordinary class for cultural subjects and general activities whenever possible. Before a child is considered for special education provision in ESF schools, assessment by the ESF educational psychologist is required.

The nine ESF primary schools include Bradbury School, Glenealy School, Kennedy School, Peak School and Quarry Bay School on Hong Kong Island, Beacon Hill School, Clearwater Bay School and Kowloon Junior School in Kowloon and Shatin Junior School in the New Territories for children of primary school age. The five ESF secondary schools include Island School, South Island School and West Island School on Hong Kong Island, King George V School in Kowloon and Shatin College in the New Territories for students of secondary school age. For children requiring more extensive learning and teaching adjustments, Jockey Club Sarah Roe School in Kowloon provides a special education curriculum geared to their needs.

MULTIPLE PATHWAYS FOR NCS STUDENTS

Alternative Chinese Language Qualifications

NCS students who have a late start in learning Chinese or have not been given full opportunities to study the local Chinese Language curriculum can apply for a subsidy to attain internationally recognised alternative Chinese Language qualifications, including those under the General Certificate of Secondary Education (“GCSE”), International General Certificate of Secondary Education (“IGCSE”) and General Certificate of Education (“GCE”) for the purpose of facilitating their academic and career advancement. Eligible NCS school candidates entering for the aforesaid non-local Chinese Language examinations are subsidised with the difference between fee levels of these examinations and that of the HKDSE (Chinese Language). Eligible needy NCS students may be granted full or half fee remission of the subsidised examination fees.

Individual UGC-funded universities have set out further details of their requirements, including the alternative Chinese Language qualifications to be accepted and the minimum grading required, as well as any specific requirements of individual undergraduate programmes. For sub-degree programmes, the Updated Revised Common Descriptors for Associate Degree and Higher Diploma Programmes under the New Academic Structure has stipulated that institutions will continue to accept alternative Chinese qualifications for NCS students who have met specified conditions. Vocational and Professional Education and Training

Some NCS students may be interested in vocational and professional education and training (“VPET”). The VTC offers a wide range of VPET programmes. All applicants, irrespective of their race or ethnic origin, who are able to meet the admission requirements, will be considered. The VTC mainly uses English as the MOI for its post-secondary 6 or above level of programmes which may be supplemented with Chinese, if necessary. Where programmes require HKDSE Chinese Language qualification for admission, alternative language qualifications may be considered for NCS applicants. Hence, NCS students may apply to VPET programmes according to their preference. They are the primary service providers of international education services and have traditionally been meeting the demand from NCS students and foreign nationals, most of whom would eventually return to their home countries for education.
