**School-Based Support Scheme Grant for
Schools with Intake of Newly-Arrived Children (NAC)**

Summary

The purpose of this circular memorandum is to invite public sector schools¹ and schools under the Direct Subsidy Scheme (DSS schools) with intake of children newly arrived from the Mainland, non-Chinese speaking (NCS) children newly joining the local education system and returnee children to apply for the School-Based Support Scheme (SBSS) Grant.

Details

2. Schools should use the SBSS Grant to flexibly provide support services for meeting the learning and adaptation needs of the children mentioned above. Education Bureau (EDB) Circular Memorandum No. 63/2026 dated 5 May 2026 announced that the rate of the SBSS Grant for public sector schools (excluding special schools) and DSS schools has been adjusted to \$3,353 per pupil per annum (pppa) at primary level and \$4,970 pppa at secondary level for the 2026/27 school year. For special schools, the rate of the SBSS Grant is \$3,725 pppa at primary level and \$5,522 pppa at secondary level.

3. In order to streamline the administration procedures for the application of the SBSS Grant, schools are required to make application for the SBSS Grant only once in each school year. Schools are invited to:

- (a) apply for the SBSS Grant in respect of the actual number of students who are children newly arrived from the Mainland, NCS children newly joining the local education system and returnee children admitted during the period from 1 September 2025 to 31 August 2026, both dates inclusive; and

- (b) apply for advance payment of the SBSS Grant for the 2026/27 school year, with reference to the number of NAC admitted for the 2026/27 school year or the number of NAC as stated in paragraph (a) above.

4. For advance payment, adjustment on the basis of the number of NAC admitted for the 2026/27 school year will be made in the next round (i.e. 2027/28 school year) of application. Schools that do not apply for advance payment of the SBSS Grant now may apply for the SBSS Grant in the 2027/28 school year based on the actual number of such children admitted in the 2026/27 school year.

6. Schools must ensure that the criteria and requirements are satisfied when applying for and using the SBSS Grant. Schools should submit the application through the “EDB Electronic Form Submission System” via the Common Log-on System (<https://eformss.edb.gov.hk/eformss/Form075>), and send the supporting documents to the Placement and Support Section of EDB at Room 1424, 14/F, Wu Chung House, 213 Queen’s Road East, Wan Chai, Hong Kong by post or by hand **on or before 15 September 2026**.
