An Educational Tour of an Overseas Country (Secondary 6)

Key Features:

With the intention of broadening students' horizons in education, enhancing their global outlook and facilitating cultural exchange, The Chinese Foundation Secondary School organized an educational tour to Australia for their students. Through this educational tour, the school had demonstrated how learning could be achieved outside classrooms. The itinerary included visits to universities, museums and places of interest, doing things that would not normally be done by tourists. Programmes were organized so that the students received guided tours of university campuses and attended seminars on various aspects of education in Australia. Students also had the opportunity to see personally how authentic learning was like with the organized sit-in class in one of the colleges, where they also participated in discussion and other activities. Farm visit and home stay had been arranged. In so doing, the students gained a deeper understanding of the different facets of life in Australia. It had been made clear at the outset that this trip was an educational one during which students were expected to learn rather than just having fun. Students had been provided with prior training before the trip, such as a background study of Australia. Moreover, students were taught to behave courteously in all situations and to exercise self-discipline throughout. The school had prepared a list of expectations laying down what needed to be done before, during and after the trip, enabling students to remain focused throughout the journey. Apart from sightseeing and touring the country to understand its social life and culture, students were required to carry out group projects to be presented in book form in the following areas: Aboriginal Culture, Biology, Education, Geography, History and Science in Australia. This educational visit overseas exemplifies how out of school activities can be used to promote multi-discipline learning on one hand and broaden students' global outlook on the other.

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Regulations

- 1. This is an educational visit. You are expected to learn from the visit rather than just having fun.
- 2. *Safety* is our primary concern. You are reminded to follow your teachers' instructions at all times.
- 3. You *must not leave* the group at any time.
- 4. In case of emergency, you should use your common sense to cope with the situation. Ask for help from a corresponding party, for example, the police.
- 5. Before the visit, you should complete a *background study* of Australia.
- 6. A *group project* is to be completed after the visit.
- 7. Since it is a group project, you are expected to *cooperate* with one another and work as a team in the course of completing the project. You should pay attention during the visit so that you will not miss out any useful information.
- 8. *Self-discipline* is expected from each one of you. You are reminded that you are representing the school. You must behave *courteously* in all situations. You must be *punctual* when attending all activities. No screaming or shouting is allowed throughout the trip.
- 9. You should not bring too much money. You are reminded to take care of your own personal belongings at all times, particularly your travel document.
- 10. As it is still summertime in Australia, you are advised to bring summer clothing. You may wish to bring a light sweater or jacket for outdoor activities in the evening. *No shorts or tank tops should be worn in public areas*.
- 11. You should take care of your own personal medication.
- 12. Rooms are assigned by teachers. You should respect and get along with your roommates responsibly.
- 13. Other than for having group discussion, no one should enter other students' rooms without prior permission from the teachers.
- 14. You may contact your family with your own cellular phones in the evening. You may not use your phone at other times unless permission is given by teachers.
- 15. You should not use the facilities in the hotel unless authorization is given.
