

Contents of the book include important events of the emperors, social policies and natural phenomenon, descriptions of people with different social status and their family trees; and a lot of information about the ethnic minorities. The book is packed with valuable materials.

(戰國)呂不韋《呂氏春秋·用眾》

(Warring States Period) Chapter "Yong Zhong", Master Lu's The Spring and Autumn Annals (by Lu Buwei)

善學者,假人之長以補其短。

(People who are good at learning will learn from other's strong points so as to make up for their own weaknesses.)

(唐)魏徴《群書治要・體論》

(Tang Dynasty) Chapter "Ti Lun", Qun Shu Zhi Yao (by Wei Zheng)

君子下學而無常師,小人恥學而羞不能。

(Gentlemen have no single teacher and they learn from various people instead. They also do not mind learning from someone with a lower social status. However, people of low quality are reluctant to learn from other people as they regard this as a sign of incompetence.)

(戰國) 荀子《荀子·儒效》

(Warring States Period) Chapter "Ru Xiao", Xunzi (by Xunzi)

(Even though you are clever, you still have to work hard and always learn from others before you can make yourself a talented person.)
