




The Starbucks workers face a number of unique problems. The company has a nationwide policy of no full time employment for non-management workers. This way they avoid having to pay benefits. People

Usually cartoons and pictures are used to satirize⁴ current affairs

→ may be drawn in an exaggerated manner


→ pay attention to the <u>characterisiters</u>, facial expression (worried, anxious, scornful), gesture & posture (the finger is pointing to somebody? The legs tremble with fear?), age (a child / an adult / an elderly?), words they say / conversation (showing different values among different stakeholders), clothes they wear (representing the rich or the poor? Which working class? What social status?)

Objects

Even an object, in order to signify the message \rightarrow they will become alive in the picture / cartoon!!! E.g. the computer can type words itself, the earth was eating up the rubbish.

Background of the picture / cartoon

Read from the background to identify whether the issue is a local one or a global one. Connecting all information with other implicit message from the pictures \rightarrow come up with an integrated understanding of the situation (Conclusion).

Language Focus: Skills for evaluating an issue

Focus: How to present your ideas in a more organized way?

- 1. Use of a topic sentence introducing your stance
- 2. Use of 'standard' expressions
- 3. Use of **connectives** to indicate the order for your points
- 4. Write a concluding sentence (optional)
- → Your presentation should basically include items 1 to 3.

1. Topic Sentence

A topic sentence should be concise and state your stance clearly.

Example: I agree that China's wealthiest citizens are increasingly quality-conscious consumers. They spend the bulk of their money on travel, healthcare and education for their children.
