	Scene 1:	

	A group of students are chatting. Suddenly there is a hubbub around them. The school is on fire. Try to play the scene in which you suddenly see the fire. Scene 2: Wandering in the streets, you suddenly notice that a robbery takes place ahead.	
10 minutes Interviewing	Divide the students into groups of 6 to 7. Teacher reports a current news story (entertainment / current affairs), then asks students to choose one person as the protagonist of the story. The selected protagonist has to answer the questions asked by other students.	Current hot news
3 minutes Conclusion	Teacher has to briefly review the drama skills students have learnt that day, including creating scenes, still images and interviewing. After that, Teacher asks students about the problem they have just encountered while expressing themselves using body movement, the feelings of getting into the characters, the advantages about getting into the characters to understand their feelings. Then, Teacher tells students there will be 3 drama sessions and encourages students to express themselves through body movement and to participate more in the coming drama education activities.

Elephant The student in the middle holds his / her nose with left hand and passes his / her right hand through left hand to act as the trunk of an elephant. The student on the left holds his / her left ear to act as the left ear of elephant while the student on the right holds his / her right ear to act as the right ear of elephant.

The three students raise their hands up and sway from side to side at the same time.



Dolphin The student standing in the middle looks up, and pouts to make a"cco-ccoo" sound; the student on the left stretches his / her left arm outward with fingers pointing out, and flaps on the thigh, imitating the left fin of a dolphin; the student on the right will conduct the same moves with his / her right arm to imitate the right fin of a dolphin.
