Enhanced Smart Teen Project 2026/27

Summary

The purpose of this circular memorandum is to invite secondary schools to apply for participation in the Enhanced Smart Teen Project (ESTP) in the 2026/27 school year and attend a briefing session on the project.

Background

2. Starting from the 2006/07 school year, the Education Bureau (EDB) has been collaborating with disciplinary forces to implement the ESTP. Training on discipline and team building has been provided for students to enhance their self-discipline, self-confidence, team spirit and resilience. As the project has yielded remarkable outcome and has been well received by schools, EDB has regularised the project starting from the 2018/19 school year so that more students can benefit.

Details

Content of the Project

3. The ESTP comprises three parts: teacher development, student training and post-camp follow-up activities. Participating schools have to join all the parts as follows:

- (a) **Teacher development:** A series of professional training activities will be arranged for teachers, including an overnight training camp and training workshops for about 12 hours. The aim of the training is to equip teachers with the skills in leading and implementing the project.
- (b) **Student training:** EDB will collaborate with the Hong Kong Police Force, the Hong Kong Fire Services Department, the Hong Kong Correctional Services Department, the Customs and Excise Department, the Immigration Department and the Civil Aid Service in organising Smart Teen Challenge Camps for Secondary 2 to 5 students, to strengthen

students' self-discipline, self-confidence, team spirit and resilience through a series of discipline and physical training.


- (c) Post-camp follow-up activities: Upon the completion of the Smart Teen Challenge Camps, schools should organise a series of post-camp follow-up activities to deepen the learning experiences the students acquired in the camps, so as to consolidate and sustain the positive changes.

Briefing Session

4. A briefing session will be organised on 20 April 2026 to help schools better understand the content, application procedures and the implementation strategies of the ESTP. Teachers responsible for implementing the project in previous years and students having participated in the ESTP will be invited to share their experiences in implementing the project and their growth and benefits gained respectively. Application Procedures

5. Schools interested in joining the ESTP in the 2026/27 school year can download the application form from the EDB website from 20 April 2026 onwards, and return it to the Guidance and Discipline Section of EDB on or before 22 May 2026.
